

FLORIDA SCHOOL RECOGNITION PROGRAM REVIEW



- What is the Florida School Recognition Program?
 - The Florida School Recognition Program provides public recognition and financial awards to schools that have sustained high student performance or schools that demonstrate substantial improvement in student performance. The program was created by the Florida Legislature in 1997 and funds were first appropriated for awards in 1998. The A+ Plan for Education standardized program criteria and awards in 1999.
- Which schools are eligible for recognition under this program?
 - Schools that sustain high performance by receiving a school grade of "A;" or
 - Schools that demonstrate exemplary improvement due to innovation and effort by improving at least one letter grade; or
 - Schools that improve more than one letter grade and sustain the improvement the following school year; or
 - Schools designated as alternative or ESE center schools that receive a school improvement rating of "Commendable" or improve at least one level.

FLORIDA SCHOOL RECOGNITION PROGRAM REVIEW

- Total Award: \$75,408
- 9.52% Fringe Benefit District Reserve: \$6,555
- Funding Amount: \$68,853
 - GOAL SAME

- A decision on how the money is disbursed must be made by February 1, 2018.
- If a decision has not been made by February 1, 2018, then the funds will be distributed equally among current classroom teachers.

FLORIDA SCHOOL RECOGNITION PROGRAM RESULTS

Proposal #1: Funding amount of \$68,853 to be evenly distributed amongst all staff who worked during the 2017-2018 school year (staff must have worked a minimum of 90 school days to qualify).

Proposal #2: \$10,000 towards school safety enhancements, priority will be given to the front door buzzer and camera system. The remaining \$58,853 to be distributed amongst all staff who worked during the 2017-2018 school year (staff must have worked a minimum of 90 school days to qualify).







SAFETY DRILLS- FIRE DRILL

- The fire alarm system will be used to initiate all fire drills.
- Students and must exit the classroom and walk in a quick, orderly fashion with their teachers to their designated area (car loop parking lot, bus loop parking lot, bus loop parking lot, P.E. court, south green space by portables, etc.) Students should remain silent until returning to the classroom.
- Teachers must take their emergency folders with them, along with their green/red emergency cards.
- Once arrived at their designated areas, teachers will take attendance of their class and hold up the GREEN communication card indicating all students have been accounted for.
- If a student(s) is missing, the teacher will hold up the RED communication card indicating assistance is needed.
- Hall monitors (SAFE team members) are assigned to each designated area and are communicating over the walkie-talkies to locate any missing students, or checking in with an "all clear" call.
- Once all zones are considered clear, the all-clear signal is given (school bell) and students and staff return to the building.
- The office manager is responsible for reporting the length of the drill on the district's fire drill database.
- Anyone on campus must participate (parents and guests).
- This is practiced at least twice a month.



SAFETY DRILLS- TORNADO DRILL

- A tornado drill will be announced over the intercom.
- The teacher has all students move to an inside wall that is away from outside windows, hanging glass, or mirrors, and ensures they are in the correct protective position.
- Once students are all accounted for, the teacher will tape the GREEN communication card in the front window of the classroom indicating "all clear".
- The teacher will tape the RED communication card in the front window indicating "assistance is needed".
- Hall monitors (SAFE team members) are throughout the school checking each hallway and classroom.
- Hall monitors will communicate over walkie-talkies to find the location of any missing students.
- Students must remain silent and in the protective position until the all clear announcement has been made.

SAFETY DRILLS- CODE RED

- Full lockdown mode: Someone is on campus who does not belong
- No movement/noise in he building other than by police
- Classroom doors should be locked at all times
- Door windows should be covered and lights off
- Students and teachers must stay in locked closets (main building); bathrooms (modules)
- If a fire alarm is pulled, do not evacuate
- If in transition between locations, recess, or P.E., the teacher will quickly collect all students and report to the closest available classroom
- Code Red will turn into a Code Yellow: Students and teachers can leave hiding, turn on lights, and resume classroom activities. No one can leave the room until a Code Green is called.
- During a Code Yellow the teacher should account for all students and hang their GREEN communication card if all students are present, or the RED communication card if students are missing.
- SAFE team will work with the teacher to make sure all missing students are accounted for.



SAFETY DRILLS- EVACUATION

- · Code Orange: Evacuation to Sam's Club parking lot
- Teachers will have students silently line up to exit the classroom as soon as the alarm is sounded.
- · Students do not bring anything with them.
- Teachers must bring their red safety folders and green/red communication card.
- All classes will exit through their designated doors and follow the sidewalk to the Sam's Club parking lot.
- The SAFE team will check each classroom to ensure all students and staff have exited the school.
- Teachers will take attendance at their designated spots. The GREEN communication card will be held up if all students are accounted for. The RED communication card will be held up if students are missing.
- The SAFE team will communicate through walkie-talkies to locate the missing students.
- · Everyone is to remain outside until an all-clear is given.
- Once students and staff return to the school, there will be no movement from the classrooms until information is given over the PA system by the principal or designee.
- Students and staff practiced an evacuation drill on Tuesday, December 18, 2018.

- East and West side gates are locked during the school day
- Open gate hours: 7:00am-8:00am; 1:45pm-3:30pm
- The main office front door is now locked at all times
- The speaker system has been updated (can hear outside better)
- In the works:
 - Front door buzzer
 - Updated camera system


