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## **SAC Minutes**

**March 20, 2019**

**7:15 am**

- **Welcome**

Ms. Pontillo welcomes the attendees & guest

- **Approval of minutes from last SAC meeting**

Mrs. Lombardo opened the meeting with the opportunity to review and approve the minutes from last SAC meeting, February 20, 2019. Ms. Ocejo motioned to approve, and Mrs. Tobon seconded the motion. Motion passed. No voting will be happening today.

- **ASCD conference**

Ms. Pontillo shared information from the ASCD conference which she and a few other faculty members recently attended. Ron Clark, a main speaker at the ASCD conference, was very inspiring. One main takeaway was about how it's important in the teaching profession to figure out how to be a consistent source of positive energy in our students' lives. However, it must be balanced with students experiencing the struggle that only comes from working hard to achieve a goal. Parents and teachers cannot be working harder than the students themselves are working. Building a student's work ethic can be difficult but the hard work will pay off in the end.

### **Broward County Stakeholder Survey**

The Survey for Broward County's stakeholders has been sent out through email to all Coral Park parents. This is the school district's effort to improve system practices across the district. The survey is offered in English, Spanish, Haitian-Creole, and Portuguese in order to meet the needs of all our school's stakeholders.

### **Mid and End of Year Reflection**

The mid-year reflection was presented at the last SAC meeting and the school is now currently working on the end of the year reflection.

### **Annual Title I 2018 – 2019 Survey**

Title I parent and family engagement survey results review. 212 of the surveys were returned. There were 6 sections which included the following: receiving information from the school on standards and testing, how to help your child with school, collaboration with the school, open lines of communication, parent and family engagement, where to find help if needed. The responses to the six sections were overall positive, falling in the strongly agree to agree categories.

## **School Compact for 2019 - 2020**

The school-parent compact for the next school year was given for review. It is similar to this current year's compact. It includes school, parent, and student responsibilities. Mrs. Worthington asked whether any parents had suggestions for any changes to the current compact. There were no suggestions for changes.

## **Parent & Family Engagement Plan**

Review of the current year's PFEP. After review, parents were asked for their input regarding parent involvement. Some activities are still upcoming, such as The Science Fair/Award Night which will be held April 16. Coral Park has already held a literacy night and a math night, so science night will be our third family engagement night this school year. Parents were surveyed to see who had attended the previous two nights. Overall opinion was positive towards the events and no suggestions were given for changes.

- **Up-Coming Events**

March 21<sup>st</sup> is the Art Show

Cubbett day is on May 9<sup>th</sup>

Zone meeting is April 4<sup>th</sup>. Ms. Pontillo went over what will be covered at the meeting. Topics include: your children and their social media/internet use. It will be held at Forest Glen Middle school.

Mrs. Clarke was willing to type up the information presented at the zone meeting to disseminate to parents who were unable to attend.

A discussion on how parents and the school must be constantly monitoring the children's' on-line access. Tips were shared on ways we can all be more vigilant in keeping our children safe when they are on-line.

- **Bond Money and Budget Up-Dates**

Orders are being placed for the 5<sup>th</sup> grade furniture. The total came to \$14,000

There is about \$11,000 that is leftover, and we would like to start using it to update the media center. Ms. Pontillo shared the picture rendering of the new media center that is planned.

Mrs. Tobon asked about updates on the playground. Ms. Pontillo said that it is still a work in process.

- **SAF Updates and Information**

Brian Katz is our new security person at the district and Mrs. Tobon discussed how he was at the most recent SAF meeting and presented information about the district.

Motions were passed. North advisory stated that if something is going to the district, they have 60 days to review and come back with a response.
