- Equity Committee Updates
  - District received grant for trainings and every school designated an Equity Liaison. The team is flexible and composed of school staff. Goal is to reflect and evaluate equity at Silver Ridge (ex: economic, social, cultural, racial, gender, intellectual, etc.). Team reviewed the plan and upcoming initiatives (staff activities, trainings, etc.). Input from SAC team and assistance with initiatives will be encouraged. - PTO Updates
  - Bookfair and McDonalds turnout and fundraiser were very successful. PTO is assisting with Boosterthon activities. Helping Student Council with Harvest Drive. Next PTO general body meeting is 11/30 @ 8:00am.
- Partnership Report
  - Everything is great! i9 will be assisting with Boosterthon.
- SAF Report
  - ESE Inclusion fair at Fort Lauderdale High School 11/8 @ 6:00pm. They will feature including companies doing interviews and multiple vendors.
  - Much of the meeting was related to transition planning (ex: Naviance) at the middle and high school levels.
  - Dr. Wanza spoke about the importance of safety and “see something, say something.” She also spoke about talking to younger kids in lieu of recent threats. It’s also important to be aware of students who may be experiencing bullying even before an act of bullying is observed (ex: mood, shift in attitude, etc.).

- Principal’s Report
  - Harvest Drive: Big thank you to PTO for all help and assistance, and a huge thank you to parents and the community for patience during this time of the year. Western High School auditorium is transformed into an incredible space for community members in need. We

are working on setting up a field trip for Student Council members to assist. Along with donations provided to Harvest Drive, organizers request monetary donations as well. At SRE, \$1 Dress Down Day funds will be used as monetary donations to Harvest Drive. November 5<sup>th</sup>-16<sup>th</sup> will be the window for collection.

- Car Line: Parents are being encouraged to have their car line signs visible. Reminders to pull all the way up and have students ready to go.
  - Fall Festivities: Traditions revised (no dressing up & no parade) due to safety. Octoberfest will be modified (all parents must be approved volunteers, not spectators).
  - Boosterthon: Parents who are volunteers are invited to attend but spectators will not be allowed. Broward County volunteer badges will be required.
  - Safety at the elementary school level is being reviewed. Students are being reminded about what is appropriate and parents are being encouraged to discuss expectations with their children. We are reminding students about expectations but being mindful of over-exposure. SRE is following all protocols recommended by the county. It's important to stress that students can speak with their teachers privately and we are working on means and conversation to empower students to reach out to school staff.

  - Safety: See Principal's Report
  - SAC Budget: \$7,793
  - Data Review: Reviewed county data and school data. We were 7 points (1%) away from being an A school. Working on continuing intervention training and implementation of new science curriculum.
  - School Improvement Plan: Core elements (goals, reflection, plans) due October 18<sup>th</sup>. The plan is available online as it is updated.

  - Additional Added Items/Concerns:
    - Parents are very concerned about condition of AC units on campus. They feel their students are getting sick and are unable to learn. Comments are being made about going to the media because there is frustration with lack of progress. Leadership is offering unused portables and spot coolers and attempting to buy fans, but the overall learning environment is impacted. Parts are not being replaced due to age and type of units, so new parts are being fabricated and no timelines are being provided for AC issues.
