C. UNIFIED ARTS

- In Art, students just finished up their "one word" project where they had to creatively design and index
 card using one adjective that positively describes themselves. All index cards were organized in a school
 mural! We are starting to now work on a peace and equality poster for peace month.
- In Spanish 2, students have just finished reviewing material from Level 1 and started a culture unit on Central America and working with adjectives to describe themselves and others. Students also completed the grammatical differences between possessive adjectives and possessive pronouns.
