Welcome and Approval of Minutes

- Meeting was called to order at 1:05 p.m.
- Ms. Unger-Fink approved the minutes from the March 12th meeting, and Mr. Curl second the approval
- Ms. Wicker asked if there is any discussion on the minutes. A vote was taken, and all members were in favor of approving the minutes.

Project Charter Meeting: Helen Boyer – Communications Liaison - Owner's Representative SMART Program

- Joe Williams: Project manager.
- This meeting is held to convey the scope, set and manage expectations, and address
 questions and concerns
- Project Charter Meetings (PCM's) occur during the design phase, after the architect/engineer has validated the scope and begun preparing the design drawings.
- History: Needs assessment: Adopted District Educational Facilities Plan; General Obligation Bond; Program Management; Project Initiation; Phased Process.
- We are waiting for the board to approve. Building 1-9 and 75: Building improvements such as AC units, roofs, electrical, HVAC, exhaust fans. We will be fixing the aluminum walkways.
- School Choice Enhancement Program. Get \$100,000 and can choose what you want to
 use the money on. Items delivered are student chairs, LCD projectors, primary
 playground upgrades, classroom blinds, and the shade structure.
- SMART (Music equipment & Technology)

- Creation Station: 3D printers are available at selected libraries; Design Studio with Adobe Creative Cloud; Virtual Reality & Augmented Reality (Rift, Vive VR & HoloLens, Meta2 AR); Gear to check out (Wacom tablets, Snap Circuits, Sphero, etc.).
- Access to the Future: live translations
- The Studio: A safe Space for teens (13-19 years old only with no parents or teachers);

- Democratization of Information: Books, Computers, Databases, Internet access, Shared Resources, website & App (Broward.org/library)
- Creation Station makes sure you have the tools you need
- Merge Cubes will work with whatever App you want to use.

School-wide Positive Behavior Plan (SPBP)

- Review of SPBP: There is a change in the reward system for the cafeteria, and support staff and administration will go into the cafeteria more often. It includes CHAMPS and lesson plans. Asked if there are any questions.

Monitoring of School Improvement Plan

- FSA data analysis and remediation. Ms. George asked if anybody could volunteer. If you are available, please let her know. You will not be assigned to your own child's classroom.
- IReady will be available for students to use in the summer.
- FACE/SEL "I am Enough" and Dia de los Ninos. It discusses how we include all our groups. Ms. Tanke spearheaded the "I am Enough" Campaign. The premise is that you should be happy with who you are. Different staff members appeared on the announcements to declare, "I am Enough". The staff received bracelets. This is a zone initiative. We are trying to reach out to all our demographic groups.
- We need nominees for the 2019-2020 SAC. We need members for next year. Please spread the word. We also need SAF and Innovation Zone representatives to attend meetings once per quarter.

Principal's Up-date

- We will still have summer camp and will work with the construction.
- We are waiting on the final inspection for the playground shade.

PTA Up-Date

- Sold 135 small bundt cakes and 18 large bundt cakes and we get about half of the money.
- Daddy/Daughter tickets will be on sale for \$35, and the 2nd child is \$15.
- May 14th is the general meeting

SAF

- Mr. Runcie gave a lot of information about the heightened focus on security. There will be additional cameras, upgrading intercom systems. There have been proposals to search backpacks randomly and using metal detector wands. They are working on what they will do at all levels, elementary through high school. They will be hiring security specialists for elementary schools.
- Referendum money will be used for raises.
- Looking more at project-based learning
- It is the district intent to fund iReady
- The state wants feedback about standards.


