SAC Minutes – November 14, 2018.

Call to Order:

A meeting of the Palm Cove Elementary School Advisory Council was held in the Cafeteria on November 14, 2018. Chair Kimberly Charpentier called the meeting to order at 5:00 PM. Jennifer Alfred will record minutes for this meeting.

Minutes:

The minutes from the October meeting were reviewed by the committee. A motion was made to accept the minutes as is by Jennifer Alfred. Second by Loan Rodriguez. All were in favor. Motion passed.

Old Business:

1. Read for the Record is tomorrow at Palm Cove. We have volunteers in all kindergarten classrooms as well as Pre-K and ASD Kindergarten to read to the students. All children will get a copy of the book "Maybe Something Beautiful" to take home after the event. Vice Mayor Tom Good will be one of the volunteers in attendance.
2. The flyers went out for our annual storybook parade next Wednesday on Halloween day. Students are encouraged to dress in a costume from a storybook. The parade details are on the website, flyer, and home link phone calls that have gone out.
3. FLKRS Kindergarten State Testing is complete and 100% of students were tested successfully.

New Business:

1. Math and ELA Classroom centers were revamped in the Team Leader/ Leadership Meeting the first week of this month. The DOK (Depth of Knowledge) levels for the students were added to the centers. A Webb's DOK chart was given to the committee and the parents.
2. The new BPIE plan was completed and uploaded. A copy of the plan is available on our school website and was available for parents to view at the meeting. There were no questions regarding the plan from the committee or the parents.

Reports:

1. Principal Report: Mrs. Davida Johnson, the school principal, gave an update on school events and welcomed everyone. She reviewed our instructional plans this year and goals for the FSA and moving our school up to the letter grade of a B. She explained the reasoning behind our new ELA and Math center plan. We needed to reach the students who are on and above grade level in the classrooms in order to move our FSA scores forward. We also have in place our PCE Excels classes which have an accelerated curriculum for our gifted and high achieving students in grades 3-5.
2. Title One: Kim Charpentier gave an update on the Title One plan. Our binder is in compliance with the state at this time with our e-binder. All parent compacts are collected for this school year. The Title 1 survey will be made available to parents in the months of December and January through our school website and a flyer will be sent home with the link. We received additional funds of \$12,000 for our school. We ordered additional curriculum materials for the classrooms with funds.

Open Agenda

The floor was opened to the members and guests for any questions and/or comments. Everyone was pleased and there were no questions for the committee or administration. The Writing Family night and Turkey Night will begin when the meeting is closed. We will be sending home information soon about our Honor Roll assemblies in the next couple of weeks for Quarter 1.

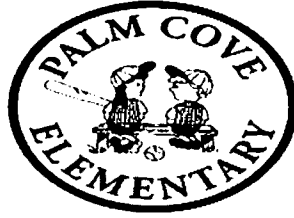
Next Meeting Date & Time:
