

Panther Run Elementary SAC Meeting Minutes—September 26, 2018

4. Curriculum Committee Reports-

a. Science- Mrs. Garcia

We have a new literacy based science adoption. STEMscopes and Science A-Z are now being used to integrate ELA standards while teaching Science standards. School wide initiative of using vocabulary cards for science words has been put in place so that these words can be an on-going yearly review. Students are being assessed by Mrs. Garcia during their Science special to provide feedback.

Science night is planned for January 30, 2019. It will be a STEM activity as in previous years where are grade levels are assigned a different project and students complete it in groups.

b. Math- Mr.s Rouhlac

Ms. Nicole Roulhac shared that this year is a gap year in our curriculum materials so we are using GO Math 2015. It comes with lots of online components. Parent guide and letter will be available on the Panther Prints and on the PRE website. One of the components is the Personal Math Trainer which is an individualized learning path for each student. It also has Math on the Spot and interactive videos available to students for extra support. Mrs. Roulhac also share what each grade level is working on in the subject of Math. Math Superstars program has already started and will run through November.

c. Literacy- Mrs. Pinto

Literacy night will be held on November 7, 2018. It will be a Superhero theme again. New Debate team will be incorporated this year. Fall book fair is coming up the week of October 8. Mrs. Pinto also shares that all 4th graders have been attending a writing seminar every Thursday to enhance writing skills.
