SAC Meeting Minutes—October 24, 2018

Kathleen Garcia filed motion to call the meeting to order at 6:19 p.m. Mr. Scott seconded the motion.

1. **Approval of September minutes:** Mrs. Garcia last month's SAC meeting minutes.
Motion to approve minutes by Mrs. Gittens, seconded by Mr. Steffenson. All SAC members in favor.

2. **Multi-Tiered System of Supports/Response to Intervention Action Plan (MTSS/RtI) Self-Assessment of Multi-Tiered Supports (SAM)-** Dr. Chacona explains the RtI process and the 3 tiers of interventions available to students. He also shared the different resources/programs being used in each tier of intervention.

3. **Review of School Improvement Plan (SIP) and School Wide Positive Behavior Plan (SPBP)-** Dr. Chacona shares with the committee this year's school improvement plan. The plan focuses on our best practices. These best practices are:
 1. Focused and Authentic Professional Learning Communities (PLC)
 2. Response to Intervention (RtI) Process
 3. Optimal internal/external Relationships
 4. Scaling up Best Practices

The school wide Behavior plan was also reviewed and discussed. The school has identified three specific behavior incidents at Panther Run and three school-wide expectations and addressed how they are being handled.

4. **Curriculum Committee Reports-**
 - a. Literacy- Mrs. Pinto: iReady reading is being used by all students at Panther Run. At this time most students have finished the first diagnostic and are ready to begin lessons. It is recommended for students to use iReady for 45 minutes each week, at school and/or home. Literacy night is coming up on November 7, 2018. Debate team will hold a super hero theme debate and then students attending Literacy Night will vote on who won the debate and receive a homework pass for their participation.

 - b. Science- Mrs. Garcia informs us that each grade level is currently working on:
 - K- Recognize plant and animal characteristics
 - 1- Making observations about plants and animals, how they resemble other family members or individuals within a population.
 - 2- Properties of matter, Classifying rocks, Properties of soil and types of soil
 - 3- Energy, Light Energy (how it travels), transfer of light and heat energy, Friction
 - 4- Identifying changes in Matter, physical and chemical properties
 - 5- Compare and Contrast basic properties of solids, liquids, and gases; demonstrate and explain mixtures and solutions.

- c. Math- Students are currently working on iReady Math diagnostic and will soon be ready to use it as another source of learning, maintaining and reteaching math skills. Mrs. Roulhac shares that the school has an emphasis on math fluency this year for fact mastery. A fluency plan has been created for each grade level.

Motion to adjourn the meeting by Mr. Steffenson at 6:48p.m., Mrs. Gittens seconded the motion.
