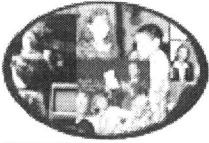

Michael Ficara will represent our school at the School Advisory Forum (SAF) and share back with our SAC.
- III. SAC Membership Voting
 - Non-Employees – 53%
 - Employees – 47%
- IV. SAC ByLaws Approval
 - Approved as written
- V. Approval of May 14, 2018 Minutes
 - Approved as written
- VI. Student Achievement on State Assessments
 - Our school moved back to an A rating this school year. Last school year we missed the A by 2 points and this year we earned out A by 2 points.
- VII. Create A+ Ballot
 - Discussed how funds are dispersed based on the total amount of school funds that are allocated to our school. Shared sample ballots from previous school years. Committee agreed to keeping the ballot the same as the A+ Ballot for 2015-16, contributing the 20% to supplemental material purchases.
- VIII. Title I Information
 - Schools who have more than 51% of our students enrolled in free/reduced lunch qualify for Title 1 funding. This school year we are a Title 1 school. Mrs. May shared that she received about \$170,000 in additional funds to help support academic achievement. Mrs. Martinez is our Title 1 Liaison and Resource Teacher. Our funds are also helping with professional development, supplemental materials, agendas for next school year. We are completing the compliance binder to support our efforts to use the funds to help with student achievement.
- IX. School Improvement Plan Goals
 - Our overall goal is to develop differentiated instruction so that we can meet the needs of all of our students.

- X. Staff Professional Development
We surveyed our teachers and noticed that a lot of our staff members struggle to attend professional development. As a school we are providing teachers with coverage in order for them to attend trainings during instructional time. We are also using team meeting days to incorporate staff development.
- XI. Extended Learning Opportunity (ELOP)
Gator Clubs started a few years ago due to parents expressing a need to get their child involved in extra curricular activities right at school. It has also helped teachers acquire extra funds by teaching a Gator Club. Our school has also benefited financially from the Gator Club funds to help with school improvement and academic achievement. Mrs. Echevarria asked if these funds will be used to replace the cover of the primary playground which was damaged by Hurricane Irma. Mrs. May shared that the cover was supposed to be replaced prior to school starting. We are still waiting for someone to come out and get that work done.
- XII. Additional School Business
Mrs. May shared information from the 1st School Advisory Forum (SAF) for the 2018-19 school year. Discussed proposed calendar options synopsis for the 2019-2020 school year. The committee agreed to proposed calendar option #1. Mr. Ficara will represent us at the next SAF meeting.

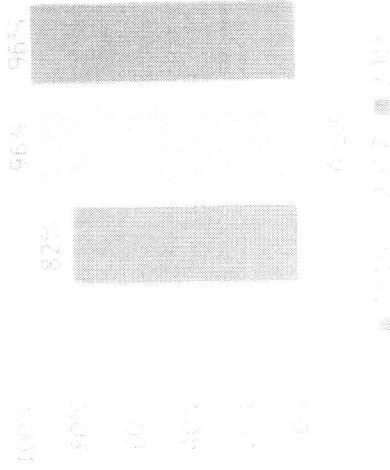

SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT SUCCESS 2018

96 percent of innovative District schools earned an "A," "B" or "C"



84 percent of innovative District schools maintained or increased their letter grade

57 innovative District schools earned an "A." Only one school received an "F"

31 innovative District schools increased by one or more letter grades

BCPS earned a District grade of "B" for the fifth year in a row, narrowly missing an "A" designation by two percentage points
