Falcon Cove Middle School, School Advisory Council (SAC) Minutes: October 10th, 2018
A meeting of Falcon Cove SAC was held at FCMS in the NEST Conference Room. David
Malca called the meeting to order at 8:37 am

*Motion to approve the September minutes by Mrs. Laurent and seconded by Mr. Lechtman.

Mr. Malca: Today we need to create and vote on a Ballot for the distribution of A+ Funds. We are proposing the following ballot Choice One: All 2017 – 2018 faculty and staff who were assigned to or employed by Falcon Cove Middle School for at least one day more than half of their specific calendar year will receive an equal portion of the Florida Schools Recognition funds awarded to Falcon Cove Middle School. All itinerant staff will receive a portion of the funds aligned to their position based on the percentage of time assigned to Falcon Cove. Choice Two: None of the above Motion to approve the ballot was made by Mr. Malca and seconded by Mr. Rodriguez. Votes was taken and passed unanimously. The ballot will be ready to go out on Monday and results will be reported next week.

- Saturday School program funding- Funding was requested for the schools Saturday School Program. The program will last 23 Saturdays and will run biweekly. We are requesting \$6,365.04 to fund the program. Motion to approve the funding was made by Mr. Malca seconded by Mr. Rodriguez. Votes was taken and passed unanimously.
- -Program ELA Tutoring After School was explained \$956.25 is being requested to facilitate the ELA tutoring program. The cost of the program would be for a supervising teacher and a teacher leader. The supervising teacher would be present from 4:00-5:15pm for the tutoring session and closeout procedures. The hourly rate for the supervising teacher would be \$25.00 The cost of teacher leader for each session will be at a rate of \$25 per week. The teacher leader's weekly responsibilities would include: creating weekly FSA Challenge packets and attendance tracking for tutors and tutees. Motion to approve the funding was made by Mr. Malca seconded by Mr. Rodriguez. Votes was taken and passed unanimously.

<u>Principal's Report Dr. Kaplan:</u> Congratulations were given to the school's Athletics department, as the Boys and Girls Soccer Teams advanced to the finals which will be played at Pompano Beach High. The feedback on the new block schedule continues to be positive. 100% core classes are in compliance with class size mandates. We are working with teachers to offer Canvas support and further trainings. We expect all teacher to utilize the Calendar application through the Canvas site.

<u>ELL Report by Mrs. Reichow on behalf of Ilza Sterling:</u> We are working with Latinos in Action and Peer Counseling tutors to provide help and support to ell students. The ESOL

reading teachers have a representative from the ESOL department and Scholastic training strategies they can use with ELL students.

ESE/Gifted by Mrs Reichow on behalf of Mrs. Bandman: We are the only Middle School having only Gifted Classes with 550 students. ESE has 3 classes this year and we have 3 supporters working with our students.

<u>Literacy Report by Laurie Reichow:</u> We just received information from the district an update with the FSA items and information on how students performed last year. 6th grade will return to a paper-based test and for the first time 7th grade students will need to type an essay for ELA. Teachers are working with students to reinforce their typing skills.

<u>Science Report by Jessica Velez:</u> Students are starting to register for the ecybermission competition. Teams are starting to put together. Teachers are working on adding lessons plans to introduce the new curriculum and trying to implement the PBL into classrooms.

Math Report by Andrea Kamay: Mrs. McLaughlin has been competing in Math Madness which is online competition. They compete with schools across the country. I showed the teachers how to use Canvas calendar. Many of the math teachers should be using it more often.

<u>History/Social Studies Report by Mrs. Stweart:</u> 8th Grade JA Biz Town trips start at end of the month and runs through November 2nd. Teachers have been preparing students with lessons from the JA Workbook. Teachers have been trained on the new Naviance program.

<u>Fine Arts Report by Mr Slowik</u> Shrek Presentations begin October 30th. Film and TV are going to their first competition in Seattle. Trip to NY is Jan 21-23.

Foreign Languages Report by Mr. Rodriguez-Colmenares: Getting ready for the World Language Competition. We are celebrating Hispanic Heritage Month so each morning we will be showcasing a different country on the announcements.

<u>PTA Report by Colleen Laurent:</u> 6th grade dance will be October 26th. Coffee with Kaplan is next week. Teachers and Staff breakfast will be October 30th. JA BizTown trip needs more volunteers. Anyone interested please contact Mr. Gillman. We currently have 680 PTA members.
