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

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# Everglades High School School Advisory Council (SAC) October 23, 2018 Minutes

I. Welcome: Ms. Alonso, SAC Co-Chair, began the meeting at 3:22 p.m. A quorum was met with 24 voting members present and 8 guests.

# II. Reading and approval of minutes:

- a. Ms. Alonso reminded the committee that minutes for the 9/25/18 meeting was sent via email and asked for any changes.
- b. Maureen Eves addresses several changes.
- c. Helene Malanga proposed added information regarding PTSA updates.
- d. Ms. Malanaga made a motion to accept the minutes with the proposed corrections to the minutes. Dr. Cash seconded the motion. All members were in favor; none were opposed.

# III. Introduction of SAC Members

a. Ms. Alonso asked if there were any new members. New members identified themselves and completed BIO forms to be added to the committee membership.

# IV. Bond Update

- a. Helen Boyer (Community Liaison), Rodney Williams (Project Manager) and Marleine Ghaby (School Choice Enhancement) presented a Bond update to discuss upcoming project information including the Scope of Work such as the Primary renovations to the Building Envelope Improvements (roofing/HVAC system), Single Point of Entry (completed) and School Choice Enhancements (technology-completed). Additionally, 328 items were purchased to enhance the music department. The total budget amount was \$4,190,000.
- b. Mr. Williams explained that the roofing project would start in late January/early February, then work would begin on replacing the chillers.
- c. Mrs. Darbar inquired about the mold issue. Mr. Williams responded by stating that evidence of mild would be evaluated through the test and balance phase of the project.
- d. Mrs. Darbar inquired about repairing the stairs that are a safety hazard. Mr. Williams responded by stating that since the condition of the stairs is a safety risk, he will address it with management.
- e. Mrs. Darbar inquired about having the school painted as the paint is wearing and bubbling and Mr. Williams stated that he will meet with senior management to make the request to paint the school with contingency dollars.

## · V. BPIE

a. Dr. Laure Cohen discussed the BPIE (Best Practices for Inclusive Education) that was recently completed by the team including ESE administrator, ESE Support, School Psychologist, ESE Teacher, and ESE Specialist. The assessments are 3-year self-assessments that is designed to take a close look at the ESE program to identify strengths and weaknesses.

- b. Dr. Cohen briefly described the ESE programs and services available to students with an exceptionality.
- c. Through the assessment, it was noted that strengths include the MTSS system that is in place, spearheaded by Mr. Hoffman, the equity and inclusiveness of students with exceptionalities in clubs and extra-curricular activities, common planning allowing for collaboration among support staff and classroom teachers and the inclusion of ESE representation in the decision-making processes within the school community.

# VI. School Counseling Plan

- a. Dr. Laure Cohen discussed the annual school counseling plan.
- b. She noted the plan aligns with the national model for school counseling
- c. The plan includes components that focus on academics, career and personal/social factors.

# VII. Exam Exemption Application

- a. Lisa Alonso explained to the committee that EHS is up for a 5-year renewal of a waiver for exam exemptions.
- b. The waiver requires all students to take mid-term exams for EOC classes. Students will not be allowed to exempt those exams.
- c. Ms. Alonso explained the process of presenting the information about the waiver and the voting process.
- d. Mr. Henry further explained that the purpose of having students take mid term exams in EOC classes is to benefit students in allowing teachers the opportunity to disaggregate the data to identify strengths and weaknesses and drive curriculum to meet students needs to promote success on final EOCs.
- e. Laura Cohen mentioned that students participating and AP and AICE courses must take mid-terms.

# VIII. Subcommittee Updates

- A. <u>Parent Involvement</u> (Mrs. Malanga): Mentioned that EHS had a successful and fun spirit week. Many parents were present to help with homecoming and fundraising activities.
- B. Student concerns (Evonna): A student from the Debate team expressed concern regarding a coach for the Debate team in the absence of the current Debate teacher that is on leave. The student noted that the coach that was covering for the teacher on leave quit after the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter and Evonna inquired about what was being done to find a replacement. Mrs. Darbar responded by stating that she and Mr. Henry are in the process of interviewing for the position and that they have contacted downtown requesting more applications.
- C. <u>Discipline</u>: (Ms. Alonso)- Students are being more compliant in wearing ID badges. She further noted that administration will continue to conduct hall sweeps to get all students to class on-time. Ms. Darbar mentioned that for students that ae caught in hall sweeps are receiving detention. If the detention is served, the infraction is not noted on the official school record. However, if students do not serve the detention, they will receive internal suspension which will be reflected in the official school record. She further noted that EHS has a new tardy policy in which staff is scanning

IDs for morning tardies and consequences are being issued. She asked that the student representatives spread the word to help encourage students to get to school on-time.

D. <u>Reading and Writing</u> (Dr. Cash): discussed reading pullouts. The department is starting a writing lab. Dr. Cash encourages students to read daily and parents to encourage reading and discuss with their children.

E. Math (Mr. Hoffman): Students are being prepared for EOCs. Mr. Dominguez is working hard with AP pre-cale students. Math tutoring is on Mondays in room 347 for any student needing extra help. Mr. Hoffman noted that teams meet regularly to share best practices, discuss student progress as determined by common assessments and develop remediation for students in need.

F. <u>Science</u> (Mrs. Franck-Bernard): Science PLCs work together and evaluate student data. Teachers of Biology meet regularly to share best practices, review data from common assessments and adjust curriculum as needed based on results. Tutoring for science is on Tuesday in room 451.

G. <u>Social Studies</u> (Mr. A. Smith): Teachers are focusing on the standards for the US History EOC. Teachers are planning to take students that are registered to vote to early voting at the Library.

H. <u>Technology</u> (Mr. Thompson): SSO is working. Teachers must encourage students to be very careful with the new laptops as each time a repair is needed, it is vert costly to the school.

# IX. SIP Monitoring:

d. All components of the SIP plan were completed and uploaded on October 16th.

# X. PTSA Update:

- a. Helene Malanga mentioned that PTSA was involved with the ESOL Parent Night to assist parents with graduation and school information.
- b. December 8th is the ESOL college day. PTSA will be helping with the event.
- c. PTSA has their 2<sup>nd</sup> student community service project this past Saturday at FIU to help clean up their nature preserve. There were 25 participants representing EHS. PTSA partnered with the Environmental Club and had PTSA students and parents attend. Director of the FIO Preserve was very impressed with our students' knowledge of the different ecosystems. There was a great turnout. The next community service project will be November 17<sup>th</sup>. PTSA will be assisting Broward College PTA with their Thanksgiving lunch for needy families in the school district.
- d. The next parent workshop is this Thursday, October 25<sup>th</sup>. PTSA will be assisting parents to complete the FASFA. Translators will be provided to ESOL families from Latinos in Action Club.
- e. PTSA will have a family night at Texas Roadhouse on November 5 from 4-10pm. Please come out and support PTSA. Take out is included. Just mention that you are with Everglades, show the flyer or picture of the flyer.

#### XI. New issues/concerns:

a. Laura Cohen announced that the Cambridge Diplomas are in. She states that they are very nice and that she is very proud. She announced that 39 students out of 74 earned the diploma.

XII. Motion to Adjourn: Dr. Cash made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Mrs. Franck-Bernard seconded the motion. All is favor. None opposed. Meeting was adjourned at 4:13 p.m.

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

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# Everglades High School School Advisory Council (SAC) December 11, 2018 Minutes

I. Welcome: Ms. Alonso, SAC Co-Chair, began the meeting at 3:08 p.m. A quorum was met with 24 voting members present and 3 guests.

# II. Reading and approval of minutes:

- a. Ms. Alonso reminded the committee that minutes for the 10/23/18 meeting was sent via email and asked for any changes. It was noted that quorum was not met at the 11/27 meeting and therefore there were no minutes.
- b. Helene Malanga proposed changes to the minutes.
- c. Ms. Malanga made a motion to accept the minutes with the proposed corrections. Another member seconded the motion. All members were in favor; none were opposed.

# III. Success Sessions

- a. Mr. T (Biology), Mr. Henry (Reading), Mr. Hoffman (Algebra/Geometry), and Mr. Smith (US History), presented proposals for success sessions to meet the needs of targeted students to help prepare for FSA exams. The total cost for the programs is estimated at a total of 16, 312.00 for teacher pay. Mrs. Darbar noted that the total cost may be adjusted once attendance is reviewed. Ms. Malanga asked about the available funds. It was stated that there is \$29,978.39 in Accountability funds and \$141, 247 in school recognition funds. It was noted that funds for Success Sessions will draw from Accountability first and then School Recognition funds if needed.
- b. Mrs. Malanga made a motion to approve \$16, 312 to be allocated for the EOC Success Sessions from Accountability funds and then from School Recognition as needed. A second member 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion, all were in favor. None opposed.

# IV. Exam Exemptions

- a. Ms. Alonso reviewed the process of applying for waiver applications, including the description of the exam exemption waiver to prohibit students from exempting midterm exams that have an EOC. Ms. Alonso explained the rationale and fielded questions regarding the policy, process and procedures moving forward with the application.
- b. Mrs. Malanga made a motion to submit the application as it was written.
- e. 23 members approved the motion, 1 member opposed.
- d. Mr. Hoffman and Mr. Henry emphasized the importance and benefits to teachers and students of students taking midterm exams in EOC courses.

# V. SIP Monitoring

a. Ms. Alonso announced that she would be attending the quarterly SIP meeting this Friday with Ms. Eves. As of right now, the school is up-to-date on all required plans and procedures. More information from the SIP meeting will be addressed at the next SAC meeting.

# VI. Subcommittee Updates

- A. <u>Parent Involvement</u> (Mrs. Malanga): Mentioned that parents continue to volunteer in various capacities. Mr. Hoffman commended PTSA for their assistance in a recent ESOL night.
- B. Student concerns (Student): A student expressed concern for the lack of textbooks available to students for AP Macro Economics that will be starting in January. Mr. T responded by stating that there is no district adopted text for the course. He informed the students that he has been in touch with the teacher assigned to the course and has provided her with a variety of resources to support the learning in the course. He noted that he also taught the course without a text. He assured the students that they will have what they need to be successful in the course. Other students announced that a group of students have been working to initiate a mental health week to promote a positive state of mind before midterm exams. They are encouraging relaxation techniques and decorating the mirrors in the bathrooms with inspirational messages.
- C. <u>Discipline</u>: (Ms. Alonso)- Students are being held accountable to arrive to school ontime. Students that accrue 5 tardies during 1<sup>st</sup> or 5<sup>th</sup> hours are required to serve afterschool detentions. If students do not serve the detention, they will be assigned internal suspension which will be noted on their school records. Mrs. Darbar reminded students that detentions do not go on their records. Mrs. Darbar announced that this is a huge problem and the hope is that if students are assigned a consequence for being late to school, they will make more of an effort to arrive on time. Mr. Henry asked the students to stress to their peers the importance of having IDs on and visible every day. Mr. Henry noted that the cost for temporary IDs is \$2 but that adds up. Mrs. Darbar mentioned that students are not able to participate in any school field trips or events until all obligations are paid, including those for the temporary IDs.
- D. Reading and Writing (Mr. Henry/Mr. Cordova): It was noted that all teachers and students are preparing for mid-term exams and have been working on the essay portion of the exam. Mr. Cordova announced that students and teachers are preparing for the Literary Fair which will be coming up on February 7<sup>th</sup>. Students should start working on their submissions.
- E. Math (Mr. Hoffman): Mentioned that Mu Alpha Theta and Mrs. Smith, the sponsor, did a great job at a recent competition. Additionally, teachers are preparing for midterms and aligning the exams to the standards of the EOC. He further announced that PSAT scores will be coming out which will provide the students and teachers with data to better prepare for EOCs. Students can log on to the website to view their results.
- F. <u>Science</u> (Mr. Hoffman): Science teachers are preparing for midterms exams and planning for upcoming tutoring sessions.
- G. <u>Social Studies</u> (Mr. A. Smith): It was noted that EHS was recognized as one of the Top 10 schools by Vocabulary.com for the month of November. He noted that teachers are preparing for the mid-terms.
- H. <u>Technology</u> (Mr. Thompson): It was noted that the warranty for the laptop computers has run out and therefore, he and Mr. Geiger are fixing all computers on their own. He asks teachers and students to please be careful with the laptops and the laptop carts.

# VII. PTSA Update:

- a. Helene Malanga mentioned that the final FASFA parent night was December 5<sup>th</sup> and 13 families showed up.
- b. The toy drive is still in progress and PTSA is still in need of gift cards to retail stores so that the 13 families that have been identified as needing help can receive gift cards.
- c. The PTSA and the Drama department helped at the war memorial museum. The students were able to get 1<sup>st</sup> hand experience working back stage. She noted that the performers were grateful for the assistance and that all were pleased with the EHS students that helped.

# X. New issues/concerns:

- a. Mrs. Darbar addressed the parents to inquire about whether they have been receiving alerts regarding code red drills. Parents reported that they have been receiving the alerts.
- XI. Motion to Adjourn: Mrs. Malanga made a motion to adjourn the meeting. The motion was seconded. All in favor. None opposed. Meeting was adjourned at 4:06 p.m.





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# Everglades High School School Advisory Council (SAC) January 22, 2018 Minutes

I. Welcome: Ms. Alonso, SAC Co-Chair, began the meeting at 3:14 p.m. A quorum was met with 22 voting members present and 2 guests.

# II. Reading and approval of minutes:

- a. Ms. Alonso reminded the committee that minutes for the 12/11/18 meeting was sent via email and asked for any changes.
- b. Ms. Forde-Marshall proposed a correction to a name.
- c. Helene Malanga proposed additional changes to the minutes.
- d. The community rep made a motion to accept the minutes with the proposed corrections. Dr. Cash seconded the motion. All members were in favor; none were opposed.

# III. Exam Exemption Application and Voting

- a. Ms. Alonso review the exam exemption application and process.
- b. The committee voted individually to present the exam exemptions to the faculty.
- e. All 22 members voted and was passed with 100% vote in favor of continuing the process.

# IV. | SIP Monitoring

- a. Ms. Alonso noted that she and Ms. Eves attended the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter SIP meeting in
- b. Information regarding the mid-year reflection was discussed and completed.
- c. Moving forward, the committee will begin to work on the 2019-20 School-Wide Behavior Plan for the next school year.

# V. Subcommittee Updates

- A. <u>Parent Involvement</u> (Mrs. Malanga): It was noted that there was a small turn-out for the recent Rachel's Challenge event. She stated that there were only 7 participants. It was suggested to possible hold the event next year with more notice and further after the winter break.
- B. Student concerns (Students): Natalie Mion stated they student government is hosting the district convention this coming Saturday the 26<sup>th</sup> from 9am-5pm. They are expecting 163 students. It was also noted that students attended the Rachel's Challenge training plan and intend to incorporate strategies in future events.
- C. <u>Discipline</u>: (Ms. Alonso)- It was noted that hall sweeps will continue and asked the students to spread the word to encourage their peers to get to class on-time. Ms. Alonso stated that hall sweeps will continue randomly and sporadically. Students caught in the sweep are required to serve after school detentions. If they do not serve, they will be assigned IS and therefore, be removed from class time. Mr. Hoffman stated that students are getting better about wearing IDs but are still not where they need to be in consistency. He asked the students to spread the word of stressing the importance. Ms. Darbar asked the students to stress the severity of the consequences

that are vaping on campus. If caught with a vape pen containing THC, the incident carries a mandatory expulsion and a felony record. The information is being presented throughout assemblies, but incidents continue to occur.

D. Reading and Writing (Dr. Cash) Teachers are preparing for Success Sessions. Focus will be 1/3 on writing. Teachers will be using USATestprep in which students will take a pre-test to get a baseline. The program will identify 3 weakest areas in order to guide needed remedial instruction. After the writing exam commences, focus will be full on reading. Mr. Henry added to committee members to encourage all students in need to attend the enrichment sessions. He noted that the department is working on incentives to encourage participation. Dr. Cohen noted that 1700 notices went out to students and so far, only 150 have been returned. A student asked if students would be able to still sign up for the camps once the sessions are underway and they answer provided was "yes".

E. Math (Mr. Hoffman): Students and teachers are looking forward to AP Calc exam which will take place in May. Geometry teachers are using the data from mid-term exams to guide instruction in preparation for the EOC. Mr. Hoffman mentioned that based on the data, students are on par with where they were last year but that the department is looking for more ways to encourage and motivate students to do well on the exam. Mrs. Forde-Marshall inquired about SAT prep sessions. Laura Cohen responded that SAT prep is available through the public library.

F. <u>Science</u> (Mr. T): Biology teachers are examining data from mid-terms exams to target areas of need/weakness to guide instruction to better prepare students for the Biology EOC.

G. <u>Social Studies</u> (Mr. A. Smith) US History EOC camp is underway. Some teachers are also hosting after school review sessions on Thursdays. Mr. Klasner is working hard on the Holocaust museum.

H. <u>Technology</u> (Mr. Thompson): The county is no longer using SSO. Now using Clever. Several teachers/parents/students noted an issue with having to sign-on to individual sites through Clever. Mr. Thompson stated that once you sign-in to the sites once, this should no longer happen if you are using Chrome.

VI. PTSA Update:

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- a. Helene Malanga mentioned that PTSA helped during Curriculum Night meeting prospective parents. Parents from Franklin Academy mentioned that they didn't receive notification of the event. They had received notification from other surrounding high schools of their events but only heard about the EHS event by word of mouth.
- b. Last Friday, January 18<sup>th</sup> was the Broward County Reflections Awards Ceremony. The theme this year was "Hero's Around Us". All three EHS entries won at the Broward County Level High School Division. Marcus Amador received 2<sup>nd</sup> place for Photography, Natalie Mion received 1<sup>st</sup> place in Dance Choreography, and Elizabeth Malanga received 1<sup>st</sup> place in Literature. First place winners will now compete at the state level. Natalie also performed her beautiful dance at the ceremony.
- c. PTSA has started the Sneaker Drive. Please donate any of your gently used paired sneakers and drop them off in the collection box in the front office. "Got Sneakers" is a recycling company committed to environmental sustainability and economic

- development through the collection and distribution of used sneakers. PTSA will be collecting until February 28th.
