- ❖ Establish quorum and review of previous minutes. Meeting began at 3:00 pm. Mrs. Mills adopted the minutes. Mrs. Tortorella seconded

New Business

- o SAC member vote 92% of faculty approved faculty members. Parent members were unanimously approved. Student members were unanimously approved.
- FACE Plan Ms. Thackery used to update the table in the front office for the information station on the FACE plan. The plan has 5 components. 1) Good customer service 2) Making sure families can connect with resources available to them 3) cultural awareness- to this end, a 10 things you should know questionnaire is going out to parents to talk about their cultural backgrounds 4) Catch them being good acknowledging when teachers and administrators provide good customer service. 5) Share social and emotional learning competencies with families
- SAC officer election Roxanne Brissett and Ashley Exterkamp were unanimously approved as Co-chairs. Dan Alonso was unanimously approved as Secretary.

Old Business

- SAC Composition update we have 33 members. We need more Hispanic members. We need an ESOL parent. Mrs. Mills said she would try to recruit some Hispanic parents.
- o SIP updates the plan is due on Thursday. The SIP is the school improvement plan that outlines how the school is meeting student needs. Throughout the year, members of the school community will come in to address how the school is addressing various parts of the SIP.
- o The waiver for Professional study days is expiring. We will soon begin the new waiver process. It is up to SAC to determine how many of the 8 days we will actually use. This last time we believed teachers would vote for 6 days rather than eight. This year we have six days.
- ❖ PTSO Update Mrs. Mills said the Score at the Top SAT class has begun. It has maxed out with 31 students. Students at Taravella and Douglas are also eligible to take the class.

There are already 5 students for January. The price is \$250 per student. Books are provided. The next PTSO meeting is November 14th.

❖ Principal's Update – Zone meeting tonight at 7:30 at Parkside Elementary. The focus will be school safety. Tuesday night is FAFSA night in the Media center at 7pm. Students who qualify for free and reduced lunch can almost definitely qualify for financial aid. Right now about 35-40% of students fill out the FAFSA. We are trying to get those numbers up. Quarter ends this week. Grades go in on Thursday. There is a Friday planning meeting. PSAT was last week. 9-11th grade took the test. There will be no re-takes for 10th and 11th grade. 9th graders will still have a re-take. There are two semi-finalists for the National Merit scholarship. During the next SAC meeting there will be district representatives to discuss the work being done with the SMART bond. Homecoming tickets are still on sale. The game is November 2nd. Today began two days of "Start with Hello" assemblies, part of the Sandy Hook initiative trying to get kids to reach out to students and break the ice with students they don't know. Nhi Tran asked when PSAT scores come out. Mr. Carruth said they should be out by the middle of December. With the 100 million dollar bond initiative passed in August there is some talk about POSSIBLY spending money to build an amphitheater for band and drama.

The SAC meeting was ended at 3:34. Bryson motioned to adjourn. Wong seconded.

SAF Meeting begins at 3:35pm. Mrs. Mills opened by thanking the security officers Bonasera and Burton for being at the meeting. There are many positions open on SAF that need to be filled. Vice-Chair and Corresponding Secretary are needed at county level. Not filling these positions could jeopardize SAF at the county level. At the last meeting a representative from Safe havens came in to talk about the safety assessments they have been doing at schools in the county to determine what each school needs to become more safe. The consultant said metal detectors are not a good idea. They are antiquated technology that would create more problems. Cameras and a central monitoring system would be more efficient. The consultant said the Safe Havens assessment would possibly qualify us for a grant. The next SAF meeting is on October 25th 10 Am to noon at Coconut Creek High School.

There were then SAF elections. Linda Mills was unanimously re-elected. Holly Erskine was nominated as co-chair. She was unanimously elected. Dan Alonso was nominated

as secretary and unanimously elected. Danielle had a question about Naviance: will parents be able to see all grades for their students in a transcript form. Ms. Brissett said Naviance is always being improved and that that connectivity could soon become available. Guidance counselors said there is a concern about students going in to change their grades because grades in Naviance would be unsecured. Jacki Merlin explained that transcripts uploaded through Naviance cannot be seen by students or parents, only securely by the schools that have requested them.
