School Update-Mr. Bianchi

- Elective Department-Coach Brown
 - Participated in the American Heart Challenge
 - Raised money for the American Heart Association at a total of \$7,200 from the school and the money will go directly to the association.
- Wolfington Post is online as the digital version
 - Student led newspaper worked on through Mrs. Lawicki's class
 - Print version is now available
 - Working with the Finance Class in the future by selling Ad space in the newspaper in order to provide funds for more hard copy prints. Hopefully, the Ads will help sponsor and pay for future print version of the newspaper.
- Industry Certification test was completed:
 - 169 6th grade students received Word certification
 - 140 7th graders received PowerPoint certification
 - 101 8th graders received Excel certification.
 - A total of 410 Industry Certification gained this school year.
 - o Mrs. Niebla-
 - 8th Grade-Microsoft Office Bundle according to the State caps middle school students at .1 FTE for every student that passes all three exams:
 - (word, powerpoint, and excel)
 - When all the exams are passed we get about \$500 per student; we are already guaranteed a minimum of \$50,000 for current certifications passed in the 2018-2019 school year. This does not include digital tools; we have only completed one round of certification. Students who have not passed will still have a 2nd and 3rd attempt.
 - The funds will help to refresh the computers or any other equipment that the programs need.
- Safety & Security:
 - Code Red Drill was November 20th in conjunction with Special Investigative Unit (SIU) within Broward Schools and Coral Springs Parkland Fire Department.
 - The drills is ran by SIU and Coral Springs Parkland Fire Department because the want to test our procedures as a school.
 - Different scenarios are ran; they are in command on what happens during the drill.
 - We went from a Code Red to Code Yellow
 - We learned a lot of information during the drill, it was a good transition.
- Money raised for fencing
 - We selected vendor for the fencing
 - School Base Project Approval form was signed
 - Waiting on permit to get started-takes about a month

- A few irrigation issues must be corrected before fencing starts
- Ballistic Protection
 - Once school base Safe Haven Analysis Report is received, it should tell us as a school what areas we can approve on and make adjustments.
 - There are two different types of ballistic protections that can be added.
 - We do not have to wait for a permit, just needs to be fabricated then installation can begin. This will take about a month once the installation begins.
- SMART Bond
 - Two Ballots was presented at the last SAC's meeting
 - Voting will start next week, the link will be sent out next week to parents
 - Parents will have one week to vote
 - One vote per student (parents are only allowed to vote once)
 - Parents will have to use their child's Single Sign On password
- Miscellaneous
 - Literacy Week-YouTube Contest, we are still in 2nd place by 100 votes the deadline for views are by February 1st. We would like to win 1st place in the State of Florida.
 - Screenagers Event for parents and community-is a movie that talks about student's usage on screen time. Screenagers is a documentary that talks about children use of the internet, access to their phones, screen time and it talks about some of the affects. This movie will bring awareness on what's going on via social media, online and technology usage. After the movie, there will be a 30-40mins presentation with tools and strategies
 - Possible schedule for February 5th at Stoneman Douglas.
- Parent Concern
 - Security in the morning before 8:30 checking IDs...Mr. Bianchi will follow up.
 - Self-Locking Doors how to raise money or budget for it if the County or Safe Haven will not pay for it.
 - Mr. Bianchi replies:
 - Storeroom locks-when the door is closed its always locked and it cannot be unlocked from the outside.
 - The district is retrofitting any door that needs repair with a storeroom lock.
 - Does not believe the District will pay for Self-locking doors.
 - For our school to get storeroom locks it will estimate around \$30,000.
 - We are still waiting for the Safe Haven Report
