- 1. Data analysis of student performance and behavioral incidents based upon race, ethnicity and gender; and
- 2. Strategies to ensure equal opportunities for students regarding elective course offerings, advanced academic courses, access to STEM related courses and programs, fair discipline and equal access to technology.

Ms. Gardner reviewed the goal and action steps for cultural competency; DES will support an inclusive curriculum/environment allowing stakeholders to develop a sense of identity while encouraging them to recognize and embrace the cultural similarities and differences of others. Social Emotional Plan

Ms. Gardner advised that the SEL plan is located in the School Improvement Plan and can be found on our website under the school info tab. Ms. Gardner reviewed Discovery Elementary School's School Mission: to provide a safe and nurturing environment that enhances learning and ensures the highest quality of education and to inspire all students to achieve social and academic excellence. In order to meet the mission and vision of DES, the school has three goals to implement School-Wide Social and Emotional Learning (SEL).

Teachers assist students in setting personal academic goals by: Helping students to recognize the feelings and perspectives of others Recognizing individual needs to interact effectively with others Creating policies that Support the Social and Emotional Learning of Students Helping students to feel a sense of belonging

Goal 1: Develop self-awareness and self-management skills to achieve school and life success.

Goal 2: Use social-awareness and interpersonal skills to establish and maintain positive relationships.

Goal 3: Demonstrate decision-making skills and responsible behaviors in personal, school and community contexts.

Ms. Gardner reviewed the strategies for students to develop social and emotional skills. Each strategy identifies ways for students to identify, manage, and demonstrate the ability to recognize their own emotions, the emotions of others, and how to respond to others whose emotions are similar and/or different from their own. Data is collected from RtI Response to Intervention Meetings, intervention feedback, and data chats.

Ms. Gardner opened the floor for any questions, concerns, input, or feedback regarding this portion of the School Improvement Plan. There were none.
