SUBJECT: READING PERFORMANCE AT BROWARD COUNTY'S

READING FIRST SCHOOLS

The Florida Center for Reading Research (FCRR) has provided school-level data summaries about the growth of students with respect to the acquisition of critical early reading skills as measured by the Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills (DIBELS). The DIBELS instrument assesses three critical skill areas for the development of reading competency: Phonological Awareness, Alphabetic Principle, and Fluency with Connected Text. The administration of DIBELS is a requirement of the Reading First program and is administered in kindergarten through third grade.

The FCRR growth indexes were provided to schools to help staff assess the effectiveness of the interventions across the spectrum of students served. A detailed explanation, and a school-by-school summary, of the four indexes of student growth were provided in the attached March 21, 2007 memorandum from the Florida Department of Education (FDOE). A brief overview of these indexes is provided below.

- Effectiveness of Core Instruction (ECI) is the percentage of students who began the school year at grade level and continued to meet grade level expectations throughout the year.
- Effectiveness of Interventions (EI) indexes the school's ability to move students at risk for reading difficulties to lower risk levels.
- Effectiveness of Interventions for Intensive Students (EI-I) measures the school's success at moving students from the "intensive" level of risk to "strategic" or grade level.
- Effectiveness of Interventions for Strategic Students (EI-S) measures the school's success at moving students from the "strategic" level of risk to grade level

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The school-level data summary provided by FCRR included each of the four indexes by grade level and for the school overall. The percentile rank with respect to all Reading First schools statewide was also provided for each index and grade level. To understand Broward's Reading First Schools performance relative to all other schools statewide, the percentile distributions of the schoolwide indexes were examined. Table 1 provides the count of schools within each quartile for each of the four indexes.

Table 1 Distributions of Broward's Reading First schools relative to statewide performance on the four growth indexes.

Review of the data in the table revealed that Broward's Reading First schools are more successful with student growth due to the core instruction (ECI) than schools statewide with 30 of the 52 schools registering in the top two quartiles. However, Broward's schools registered mixed levels of success at moving students at risk for reading deficiencies. While 32 school scored in the top two quartiles with regard to moving intensive students (EI-I), Broward's Reading First schools were less successful at moving strategic level students to grade level with 30 of the schools scoring in the bottom two quartiles (EI-S).

These data reflect performance as of the February DIBELS administration. Additional analyses will be forthcoming from FCRR and FDOE following the May DIBELS. Each school has already received their specific data and are using these data to identify areas of concern. A low index for a particular grade and risk level indicates which student groups need immediate additional assistance. School administrations are using these data, along with classroom walkthroughs, to check the fidelity of implementation for the existing interventions. In addition, Primary Education has created a database of these data to share with the Reading First schools to support the sharing of best practices across school sites. We have asked the Florida Center for Reading Research (FCRR) to provide you with some additional analyses of your Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills (DIBELS) data that we hope will give you another tool in working with your *Reading First* schools to improve student outcomes in reading. This is the first of two data reports you will receive that are based on 06-07 data. The report contains four indices that provide you with information about the growth of individual students in acquiring critical early reading skills.

We have added two additional indices to this report that are related to the effectiveness of interventions (EI). To improve the precision of the previously reported EI index, we are providing more detailed analysis of the growth of students who began the year performing below grade level expectations on the DIBELS measures. This will allow principals, reading coaches, and teachers to evaluate the effectiveness of their interventions across the full range of risk levels in the Progress Monitoring and Reporting Network (PMRN). These new indices are explained following our discussion of the two indices you received last year.

Effectiveness of Core Instruction (ECI) — this index shows the percentage of students who began the year reading "at grade level" and are continuing to meet grade level expectations at the mid-year assessment. This index tells you whether the core instruction is sufficiently powerful to produce a year's growth in reading skill for a year's worth of instruction. If too many students begin the year at grade level, but "lose ground" against grade level standards during the year, then the instruction being provided is not sufficient to meet the needs of these students.

Effectiveness of Interventions (EI) —this index shows the percentage of your students who began the year at some level of risk for reading difficulties (reading below grade level) but who have grown rapidly enough to advance to a lower level of risk at the mid year assessment (i.e. they move from intensive to strategic, from intensive to grade level, or from strategic to grade level). This index, and the two more specific ones explained below, provide information about how effectively intervention programs are working to accelerate the development of students who are lagging behind in reading growth. Please note that the overall EI index is calculated in a slightly different way this year than last year in order to acknowledge growth of students at the highest risk levels that may move from intensive to strategic. It remains the most general overall summary of intervention effectiveness provided by these analyses.

The two new indices are:

Effectiveness of Interventions for Intensive Students (EI-I) — this index shows the percentage of students that moved from the "intensive" level to the "strategic" level or to grade level.

Effectiveness of Interventions for Strategic Students (EI-S) — this index shows the percentage of students that moved from the "strategic" level to grade level.

Each of the indices are calculated separately for each grade level (K-3) so that you can evaluate the strength of reading instruction at each grade level within your school. We have also provided percentile ranks for each index that show where your school falls within the distribution of all *Reading First* schools in Florida. This will enable you to see how your school is performing in comparison with all other *Reading First* schools at each grade level.

For each grade, the index of effectiveness is presented in the left column (scale = 0 to 100), and the percentile rank for that index compared to all *Reading First* schools in Florida is presented in the right column (scale = 1 to 99). The number in parentheses immediately below the index at each grade level is the number of students used to calculate the index. For example, if your school had an ECI value of 60 for first grade, with a value of 30 in parentheses below, this means that 60% of the 30 first grade students that were on grade level at Assessment 1 and remained in your school through the mid-year assessment were still reading on grade level at mid-year.

Once again, the EI indices were calculated using only students who were attending a school at both Assessment 1 and Assessment 2. For example, if a school had an EI-I value of 10 for first grade with a value of 20 in parentheses below, it means that 10% of the 20 first grade students who began the year at the intensive level and were still in the school at Assessment 2, had progressed rapidly enough to be at either the strategic level or grade level by Assessment 2.

If you compare the numbers used to calculate the indices with the actual number of students in the school at Assessment 2, you may find that the numbers differ slightly. This is because the indices are calculated using only students who were attending the school at both assessment periods.

We hope that you will use this report to assist you in making decisions about resource distribution, professional development, coaching services, and long and short-term goal setting for your schools. If you see areas of possible concern in this report, we would encourage you to contact your District *Reading First* Coordinator for assistance. We also recommend that you work with your *Reading First* Professional Development Coordinators Gena Feury <gena.feury@fldoe.org>, Ken Kronheim <ken.kronheim@fldoe.org> in developing a plan for possible improvement.
