SUBJECT: 2006-07 SCHOOL ACCOUNTABILITY RESULTS: TITLE I SCHOOLS

AND THE NO CHILD LEFT BEHIND (NCLB) LEGISLATION

In June, Governor Charlie Crist and Education Commissioner Jeanine Blomberg released the 2006-07 school accountability results, including Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) designations under the Federal No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB). The AYP results for Broward County Public Schools (BCPS) were previously released, along with the School Grade information and are available at: http://www.broward.k12.fl.us/studentassessment/Releases/Released%202006-07/SGAYP060707-4%20revised.pdf. The present memorandum highlights AYP results for Title I schools within BCPS.

No Child Left Behind: Adequate Yearly Progress

The NCLB legislation requires that specified student subgroups (five ethnic groups, students with disabilities, students learning English, and economically disadvantaged students) in schools, districts, and the state as a whole attain adequate yearly progress (AYP) in Reading, Mathematics, and Writing. As part of the annual increase in performance criteria for AYP, the Florida Department of Education (FDOE) raised the proficiency targets for Reading and Mathematics again during the 2006-07 school year. The target for Reading proficiency was 51% (up from 44% in 2005-06) and Mathematics proficiency was 56% (up from 50% in 2005-06). In addition to these targets, the proportion of high achieving (Level 3.0 or higher) students in Writing must increase by one percentage point annually, unless the proportion is at or above 90%. Finally, high school graduation rate must continue to increase on an annual basis if it is not already at or above 85%.

According to the NCLB legislation, all schools will be evaluated with regard to AYP and the results reported to the public. However, only schools that receive federal funds under Title I allocations are at risk of being sanctioned for failure to make AYP. In Broward, 108 public

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schools eligible for an AYP designation currently receive Title I funds. Title I schools that fail to meet AYP for two consecutive years are considered to be in need of improvement, and must provide alternatives to students. Such alternatives may consist of offering students the option to transfer to another school that did meet AYP standards or offer students the option to participate in a different program within the school.

If a school does not make AYP for three years, the school remains in school-improvement status, and the District must continue to offer public school choice to all students. In addition, students from low-income families are eligible to receive Supplemental Educational Services (SES), such as tutoring and other after school services that have been approved by the state. To qualify, a student must be attending a Title I school that has not made AYP for three consecutive years. The student must also be documented as a member of a low-income family and may also be prioritized according to academic achievement. A student cannot receive both school choice and SES.

If a school fails to make AYP for four years, the District must implement *corrective actions* to improve the school. Such actions may include replacing certain staff or duly implementing a new curriculum, while continuing to offer public school choice for all students and supplemental educational services for low-income students.

If a school fails to make AYP for a fifth year, the District must initiate plans for *restructuring* the school. This may include reopening the school as a charter school, replacing all or most of the school staff or turning over school operations either to the state or to a private company with a demonstrated record of effectiveness.

Table 1 shows the AYP status for Broward Title I schools for 2002-03, 2003-04, 2004-05, 2005-06, and 2006-07. As seen in the table, 73 Title I schools (39 Elementary, 20 Middle, and 14 Charter schools) failed to meet AYP during the 2006-07 school year. Of the 108 Title I schools, 8 (3 Elementary, 1 Middle school, and 4 Charter schools) must offer public school choice in 2007-08. The District will be taking steps to provide the choices to interested parents. In addition to choice, 7 Title I schools (6 Elementary, and 1 Middle school) must also offer supplemental educational services for low-income students. In addition, a two-year plan to assist in the improvement of the school will be developed. The District will ensure that the school receives needed technical assistance as it develops and implements its improvement plan. In 2006-07, 23 (19 Elementary, 2 Middle, and 2 Charter schools) schools failed to meet AYP for the fourth year and will enter corrective action for the first time. In addition to continuing to offer public school choice and supplemental educational services, BCPS will implement corrective action plans to improve these schools. Finally, 25 schools (9 Elementary, and 16 Middle) failed to meet AYP for the fifth year and will be required to write a plan for restructuring in addition to the existing consequences. If any of these schools fail to meet AYP in 2007-08 (sixth year of not meeting AYP), they must implement the restructuring plan during the 2008-09 school year. Florida is using a tiered system of restructuring. The requirements for restructuring are different depending on a school's grade and the percentage of AYP indicators missed.
