**SUBJECT: 2010-11 PRELIMINARY SAT/NATIONAL MERIT SCHOLARSHIP  
QUALIFYING TEST RESULTS**

This is the eleventh year that Broward has participated in the partnership between the College Board and the Florida Department of Education (FDOE) utilizing the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT) to identify student readiness for college-level work. The report presents data regarding the 2008-09 through 2010-11 administrations of the PSAT for both 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> grade participants. Grade 10 participation rates are essentially unchanged over the past three years, at approximately 83%. **Tenth grade mean scores in Broward were similar to Florida mean scores. Eleventh grade participants in Broward earned higher mean scores than their peer across the state and the nation.**

**What is the purpose of this report?**

School staff members use PSAT results as a source of information to identify students for participation in upper-level course enrollment. Area Directors and Principals take steps to advocate increased participation, particularly where the schoolwide or subgroup participation rate falls below 70%.

**How should staff use these data?**

The attached report provides district and school-level summaries of PSAT performance. Schools should use the data from this report to identify content areas of instructional strength and areas in need of improvement. Additionally, the Research Services Department and school guidance staff will analyze individual student PSAT results and use the College Board AP Potential Report to identify students for participation in high rigor courses such as Advanced Placement, Dual Enrollment, or Honors.

# Assessment Brief

## 2010-11 PRELIMINARY SAT/ NATIONAL MERIT SCHOLARSHIP QUALIFYING TEST

Florida's Specific Appropriation 107 allocates funding statewide for administration of a preliminary college entrance examination to all tenth grade students. Broward County Public Schools (BCPS) selected the College Board's Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT) for administration to tenth grade students. As directed by the state, student participation in districtwide PSAT testing is voluntary, but any tenth grade student who opts to participate has all costs covered by the state.

Students who participate in PSAT receive a wealth of information useful to forming their post-secondary plans. The Student Score Report allows students to identify their levels of proficiency in each of the reasoning skill areas and then work on improvement before entering college or taking the SAT. The Score Report also contains interpretive and college planning information. The PSAT scale of 20 to 80 directly correlates to the SAT scale of 200 to 800. Each student receives three scores (Critical Reading, Mathematics, and Writing Skills) as well as estimated scores on the SAT. Students also receive the answers and explanations for every question on the PSAT (College Board, 2009).

School administrators also receive important and useful data. The PSAT Summary of Answers provides different ways for school staffs to analyze their students' performance in a manner that keeps the focus on the students' skills, not their scores (College Board, 2009). Schools also receive the AP Potential report to aid in identifying academically promising students to participate in Advanced Placement (AP) courses.

### *Test Description*

The PSAT measures the Critical Reading, Mathematical Reasoning, and Writing skills that are important to success in college-level scholarship. By taking the PSAT in grade 10, students gain experience with the format and content of the SAT. The examination is intended to present an opportunity for students to practice for the SAT by providing questions similar to those on that assessment. The PSAT is also a qualifying examination for several scholarship and recognition programs including the National Merit Scholarship Program.

Because the State of Florida supports participation in the PSAT by providing the test to tenth grade public school students at no cost, in Broward County many more sophomores than juniors take the assessment. Nearly all students nationwide who take the test indicate they plan to attend college, whereas this is not necessarily the case in Florida or Broward County.

## Method

The Broward County data summarized herein were extracted from the District's Data Warehouse after PSAT scores were linked with demographic and enrollment records. If more than one score was reported for a student, only the most recent result was included for analysis. All reported counts are unduplicated. Broward, state, and national data include results for both sophomores and juniors who took the PSAT. National results are for students who self-reported as planning to attend college, whereas Broward and state data include a broader range of students. Thus, for tenth grade, the national mean scores tend to be slightly higher than local results.

## Results

### *Participation Rates*

The test results included in this report are for students who participated in PSAT administrations over the past three years. As displayed in Table 1, there has been little variability in grade 10 or 11 enrollment or participation. The PSAT is more commonly taken by tenth grade students; in grade 11 most students participate in the actual SAT.

Table 2 (next page) summarizes participation rates disaggregated by the three largest ethnic groups represented in the district. There were no significant changes in the enrollment totals for any of these groups. Grade 10 participation rates were essentially unchanged for each ethnic group – less than a 1 point change for Hispanic and White students, and a 2 point increase for Black students.

At Grade 11, the enrollment totals of the ethnic groups remained virtually unchanged from the previous year. Participation rates were considerably lower than in tenth grade. However, grade 11 students must pay to participate in PSAT testing, and many already took the assessment in Grade 10. In grade 11, most students take the full SAT assessment.

Table 3 summarizes three years of national, Florida, and Broward scores. Broward's grade 10 mean scores have varied by less than one point over the three year span. Florida and Broward grade 10 scores are slightly lower than the national mean scores. Again, this reflects that most national test-takers are self-selected college hopefuls, whereas in Florida a more diverse pool of students participate in the exam. **Performance results are strong in grade 11, with Broward students surpassing the mean scores of their peers across the state and nation in all three subject areas.** New in 2010-11, College Board has developed college readiness benchmark scores. These represent the scores a student should attain to be considered "on-track" for college following their senior year. Note that even the national sample of students fall well below the grade 10 benchmark scores. **In grade 11, the mean scores of Broward students exceeded the benchmark scores in both Reading and Mathematics.**

Table 4 summarizes the mean performance of tenth and eleventh grade Black, Hispanic, and White students. When compared to the previous year, grade 10 mean scores were stagnant or showed slight decline for each ethnic group.

**In Grade 11, Black students made modest gains on all three subtests for the second consecutive year.** White students also demonstrated increases on each subtest. Hispanic students declined slightly in Writing. Grade 11 performance was higher than tenth grade performance in all areas and for all three subgroups.

Table 5 displays gaps in mean scores for students in the largest ethnic groups from the past three years. Examination of the table reveals that differences remain between Black, Hispanic, and White students in Broward County. However, **in grade 10, the gaps between Black and White students and between Hispanic and White students narrowed slightly in all three subjects** when compared to the baseline year of 2008-09.

#### *School Participation Rates and Performance, Overall and by Ethnicity*

Several Appendices are attached to provide detailed school-level data. Appendix A provides tenth grade total enrollment and PSAT participation from the 2008-09, 2009-10, and 2010-11 school years, disaggregated by ethnicity, for each school. Participation rates below 70% (schoolwide or for an ethnic group) during the 2010-11 school year are bolded for easy reference. Some instances of low school or ethnic group participation rates occurred at ESE or alternative centers or at locations with small enrollment numbers. Caution should be used when viewing results of groups with small enrollment numbers. Finally, no data are reported when fewer than 10 students are enrolled.

Appendix B provides grade 10 PSAT mean scale scores for Black, Hispanic, and White students by school. Again, no data are reported when fewer than ten students were tested. Caution must be used when viewing gains or declines in Appendix B as the number of students in each ethnic group can vary significantly from school to school and year to year.

Appendix C displays mean scores for tenth and eleventh grade participants during 2009-10 by school. The mean scores for tenth and eleventh grade students in the state and the nation are also provided for reference and comparative purposes. Again, caution should be exercised when comparing data within Florida to national averages, as most national participants are college-bound voluntary participants, whereas Florida provides the opportunity for all tenth grade students to participate at no cost.

Broward is committed to providing advanced educational opportunities which give students the experience and knowledge needed for success in college-level coursework. School staff members use PSAT results as a source of information to identify students for participation in upper-level course enrollment. Area Directors and Principals take steps to advocate increased participation, particularly where the schoolwide or ethnic group participation rate falls below 70%.
