SECTION 3, GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1. <u>SEALED BID REQUIREMENTS:</u> The "Bidder Acknowledgement Section" must be completed, signed and returned with the bid. The Bid Summary Sheet pages on which the Bidder actually submits a bid, and any pages, upon which information is required to be inserted, must be completed and submitted with the bid. The School Board of Broward County (SBBC) reserves the right to reject any bid that fails to comply with these submittal requirements.
 - a) <u>BIDDER'S RESPONSIBILITY</u>: It is the responsibility of the Bidder to be certain that all numbered pages of the bid and all attachments thereto are received and all Addendum released are received prior to submitting a bid without regard to how a copy of this ITB was obtained. All bids are subject to the conditions specified herein on the attached bid documents and on any Addenda issued thereto.
 - b) <u>BID SUBMITTED</u>: Completed bid must be submitted in a sealed envelope with bid number and name clearly typed or written on the front of the envelope. Bids must be time stamped in Procurement and Warehousing Services on or before 2:00 p.m. ET on date due for bid to be considered. Bids shall be opened at 2:00 p.m. ET on date due. Bids submitted by telegraphic or facsimile transmission shall not be accepted.
 - c) EXECUTION OF BID: Bid must contain an original manual signature of an authorized representative in the space provided above. All bids must be completed in ink or typewritten. If a price correction is necessary, draw a single line through the entered figure and enter the corrected figure or use an opaque correction fluid. All price corrections must be initialed by the person signing the bid even when using opaque correction fluid. SBBC reserves the right to reject any bid or bid item completed in pencil or any bid that contains illegible entries or price corrections not initialed.
 - d) BIDDING PREFERENCE LAWS: ALL BIDDERS MUST COMPLETE AND SUBMIT THE LEGAL OPINION OF BIDDER'S PREFERENCE FORM IN ORDER TO BE CONSIDRED FOR AWARD. The State of Florida provides a Bidder's preference for Florida vendors for the purchase of personal property. The local preference is five (5) percent. Bidders outside the State of Florida must have an Attorney, licensed to practice law in the out of–state jurisdiction, as required by Section 2, Chapter 287.084, Florida Statutes, execute the "Opinion of Out-of-State Bidder's Attorney on Bidding Preferences" form and must submit this form with the submitted bid. Such opinion should permit SBBC's reliance on such attorney's opinion for purposes of complying with Chapter 287.084, Florida Statutes. Florida Bidders must also complete its portion of the form. Failure to submit and execute this form, with the bid, shall result in bid being considered "non-responsive" and bid rejected.
- PRICES QUOTED: Deduct trade discounts and quote firm net prices. Give both unit price
 and extended total. Prices must be stated in units to quantity specified in the bidding
 specification. In case of discrepancy in computing the amount of the bid, the Unit Price
 quoted shall govern.

All prices quoted shall be F.O.B. destination and freight prepaid (Bidder pays and bears freight charges). Awardee owns goods in transit and files any claims. Discounts for prompt payment: Award, if made, shall be in accordance with terms and conditions stated herein. Each item must be bid separately and no attempt is to be made to tie any item or items in with any other item or items. **Cash or quantity discounts offered shall not be a consideration in determination of award of bid(s).** If an Awardee offers a discount or offers terms less than Net 30, it is understood that a minimum of 30 days shall be required for payment, and if a payment discount is offered, the discount time shall be computed from the date of satisfactory delivery at place of acceptance and receipt of correct invoice at the office specified.

- a) <u>TAXES</u>: SBBC does not pay Federal Excise and State taxes on direct purchase of tangible personal property. The applicable tax exemption number is shown on the Purchase Order. This exemption does <u>not</u> apply to purchases of tangible personal property made by contractors who use the tangible personal property in the performance of contracts for the improvement of SBBC owned real property as defined in Chapter 192, Florida Statutes.
- b) <u>MISTAKES</u>: Bidders are expected to examine the specifications, delivery schedules, bid prices and extensions, and all instructions pertaining to supplies and services. Failure to do so shall be at Bidder's risk.
- c) <u>CONDITION AND PACKAGING</u>: It is understood and agreed that any item offered or shipped as a result of this bid shall be new (current production model at the time of this bid) unless otherwise specified. All containers shall be suitable for storage or shipment and all prices shall include standard commercial packaging.
- d) <u>UNDERWRITERS' LABORATORIES</u>: Unless otherwise stipulated in the Bid, all manufactured items and fabricated assemblies shall be UL listed where such has been established by UL for the item(s) offered and furnished. In lieu of the UL listing, Bidder may substitute a listing by an independent testing laboratory recognized by OSHA under the Nationally Recognized Testing Laboratories (NRTL) Recognition Program.

- BIDDER'S CONDITIONS: Bid conditions and specifications shall not be changed, altered or conditioned in any way. SBBC specifically reserves the right to reject any conditional bid.
- 3. <u>SAMPLES:</u> Samples of items, when required, must be furnished free of expense within five (5) working days of request unless otherwise stated and, if not destroyed, will, upon request, be returned at the Bidder's expense. Bidders shall be responsible for the removal of all samples furnished within 30 days after bid opening. All samples shall be disposed of after 30 days. Each individual sample must be labeled with Bidder's name, bid number and item number. Failure of Bidder to either deliver required samples or to clearly identify samples as indicated may be reason for rejection of the bid item. Unless otherwise indicated, samples should be delivered to Procurement and Warehousing Services, The School Board of Broward County, Florida, 7720 West Oakland, Park Boulevard, Suite 323, Sunrise, Florida 33351-6704.
- 4. <u>DELIVERY:</u> All deliveries shall be F.O.B. destination point. Unless actual date of delivery is specified (or if specified delivery cannot be met), show number of days required to make delivery after receipt of Purchase Order in space provided. Delivery time may become a basis for making an award (see Special Conditions). Delivery shall be within the normal working hours of the user, Monday through Friday, excluding state holidays and days during which SBBC administration is closed.
- 5. <u>INTERPRETATIONS:</u> Any questions concerning conditions and specifications must be submitted in writing and received by Procurement and Warehousing Services no later than ten working days, or as stated in the Special Conditions, prior to the original bid opening date. If necessary, an Addendum shall be issued.
- 6. AWARDS: In the best interest of SBBC, SBBC reserves the right to: 1) withdraw this ITB at any time prior to the time and date specified for the bid opening; 2) to reject any or all bids received when there are sound documented business reasons that serve the best interest of SBBC; 3) to accept any item or group of items unless qualified by Bidder; and 4) to acquire additional quantities at prices quoted on this ITB unless additional quantities are not acceptable, in which case, the bid sheets must be noted "BID IS FOR SPECIFIED QUANTITY ONLY." All awards made as a result of this bid shall conform to applicable Florida Statutes and shall be governed by the laws of the State of Florida, and must have venue established in the 17th Judicial Circuit Court of Broward County, Florida or the United States Court of the Southern District of Florida.
- BID OPENING: Shall be public, on the date and at the time specified on the bid form.
 All bids received after that time shall not be considered.
- ADVERTISING: In submitting a bid, Bidder agrees not to use the results there from as a part of any commercial advertising without prior approval of SBBC.
- 9. <u>INSPECTION, ACCEPTANCE & TITLE:</u> Inspection and acceptance shall be at destination unless otherwise provided. Title to/or risk of loss or damage to all items shall be the responsibility of the Awardee until acceptance by the buyer unless loss or damage resulting from negligence by the buyer. If the materials or services supplied to SBBC are found to be defective or not conform to specifications, SBBC reserves the right to cancel the order upon written notice to the seller and return product at Awardee's expense.
- 10. <u>PAYMENT:</u> Payment shall be made by SBBC after the items awarded have been received, inspected, found to comply with award specifications and free of damage or defect and properly invoiced. All payments shall be made by ACH (Automated Clearing House) for automatic deposits (credits).
- 11. CONFLICT OF INTEREST AND CONFLICTING EMPLOYMENT OR CONTRACTUAL RELATIONSHIP: Section 112.313 (3) and (7), Florida Statutes, sets forth restrictions on the ability of SBBC employees acting in a private capacity to rent, lease, or sell any realty, goods or services to SBBC. It also places restrictions on SBBC employees concerning outside employment or contractual relationships with any business entity which is doing business with SBBC. Each Bidder is to disclose any employees it has who are also SBBC employees by submitting Attachment 1, Disclosure of Potential Conflict of Interest and Conflicting Employment or Contractual Relationship, with its Bid. Any employees identified by the Bidder when completing Attachment 1 should obtain legal advice as to their obligations and restrictions under Section 112.313 (3) and (7), Florida Statutes.
- 12. INSURANCE: Bidder, by virtue of submitting a bid, shall be in full compliance with paragraph 20: LIABILITY INSURANCE, LICENSES AND PERMITS of the General Conditions. Insurance Requirements are shown in FORMS AND ATTACHMENTS Section of this ITB. Bidder shall take special notice that SBBC shall be named as an additional insured under the General Liability policy including Products Liability.

The insurance policies shall be issued by companies qualified to do business in the State of Florida. The insurance companies must be rated at least A-VI by AM Best or Aa3 by Moody's Investor Service. All policies must remain in effect during the performance of the contract.

- 13. <u>LICENSES, CERTIFICATIONS AND REGISTRATIONS:</u> As of the Bid Opening Date, Bidder must have all Licenses, Certifications and Registrations required when performing the services as described herein, in order for Bid to be considered a responsive and responsible Bid. Licenses, Certifications and Registrations required for this Bid shall be as required by Chapter 489, Florida Statutes, as currently enacted or as amended from time to time; by the State Requirements for Educational Facilities (SREF), latest version; and by Broward County, Florida. Bidder must submit a copy of all its current Licenses, Certifications and Registrations required as described herein, either with its Bid or within five working days of notification.
 - An Awardee who has any License, Certification or Registration either suspended, revoked or expired after the date of the Bid Opening, shall provide notice to the Director of Procurement & Warehousing Services within five working days of such suspension, revocation or expiration. However, such suspension, revocation or expiration after the date of the Bid Opening shall not relieve the Awardee of its responsibilities under this ITB.
- 14. PATENTS & ROYALTIES: The Awardee, without exception, shall indemnify and save harmless SBBC and its employees from liability of any nature or kind, including cost and expenses for any copyrighted, patented, or unpatented invention, process, or article manufactured or used in the performance of the contract, including its use by SBBC. If the Awardee uses any design, device, or materials covered by letters, patent, or copyright, it is mutually understood and agreed without exception that the bid prices shall include all royalties or cost arising from the use of such design, device or materials in any way involved in the work.
- 15. <u>OSHA:</u> The Awardee warrants that the product supplied to SBBC shall conform in all respects to the standards set forth in the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970, as amended, and the failure to comply with this condition shall be considered as a breach of contract.
- SPECIAL CONDITIONS: The Superintendent or Designee has the authority to issue Special Conditions and Specifications as required for individual bids. Any and all Special Conditions that may vary from these General Conditions shall have precedence.
- 17. <u>ANTI-DISCRIMINATION:</u> SBBC, prohibits any policy or procedure which results in discrimination on the basis of age, color, disability, gender identity, gender expression, national origin, marital status, race, religion, sex or sexual orientation. Individuals who wish to file a discrimination and/or harassment complaint may call the Executive Director, Benefits, Employment Services and EEO Compliance at 754-321-2150 or Teletype Machine TTY 754-321-2158.
- 18. QUALITY: All materials used for the manufacture or construction of any supplies, materials or equipment covered by this bid shall be new unless otherwise specified. The items bid must be new, the latest model, of the best quality and highest grade workmanship.
- 19. <u>LIABILITY INSURANCE, LICENSES AND PERMITS:</u> Where Awardees are required to enter or go onto SBBC property to deliver materials or perform work or services as a result of a bid award, the Awardee agrees to The Hold Harmless Agreement stated herein and shall assume the full duty obligation and expense of obtaining all necessary licenses, permits and insurance. The Awardee shall be liable for any damages or loss to SBBC occasioned by negligence of the Awardee (or agent) or any person the Awardee has designated in the completion of the Contract as a result of their bid.
- 20. <u>BID BONDS</u>, <u>PERFORMANCE BONDS AND CERTIFICATES OF INSURANCE</u>: Bid bonds, when required, shall be submitted with the bid in the amount specified in Special Conditions. Bid bonds shall be returned to non-Awardees. After acceptance of bid, SBBC shall notify the Awardee to submit a performance bond and certificate of insurance in the amount specified in Special Conditions. Upon receipt of the performance bond, the bid bond shall be returned to the Awardee.
- CANCELLATION: In the event any of the provisions of this bid are violated by the Awardee, the Superintendent shall give written notice to the Awardee stating the deficiencies and unless deficiencies are corrected within five days, recommendation shall be made to SBBC for immediate cancellation.
- 22. IRREVOCABILITY OF BID: A bid may not be withdrawn before the expiration of 90 days from the date of bid opening.
- INFORMATION NOT IN ITB: No verbal or written information which is obtained by a Bidder other than by information within this document or Addenda to this ITB shall be binding on SBBC.
- 24. <u>EXPENDITURE:</u> No guarantee is given or implied as to any sums payable or the quantity or scope of any award under this ITB. SBBC is not obligated to place any order for goods/services as a result of this award. Order placement shall be based upon the needs and best interest of SBBC.

- 25. <u>BILLING INSTRUCTIONS:</u> Invoices, unless otherwise indicated, must show Purchase Order numbers and shall be submitted in duplicate to The School Board of Broward County, Florida, Accounting and Financial Reporting Department, Attn: Accounts Payable, 600 S.E. 3rd Avenue, 7th Floor, Fort Lauderdale, Florida 33301. (Unless otherwise stated in the Special Conditions) Payment shall be made a minimum of 30 days after delivery, authorized inspection and acceptance. When vendors are directed to send invoices to a school, the school shall make direct payments to the vendor.
- NOTE TO VENDORS DELIVERING TO MATERIALS LOGISTICS CENTRAL (WAREHOUSE): Receiving hours are Monday through Friday (excluding state holidays and days during which SBBC administration is closed) 7:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. ET.
- SUBSTITUTIONS: SBBC SHALL NOT accept substitute shipments of any kind.
 Awardees are expected to furnish the brand quoted in their bid once awarded by SBBC. Any substitute shipments shall be returned at the Awardee's expense.
- FACILITIES: SBBC reserves the right to inspect the Awardee's facilities at any time
 with prior notice. SBBC may use the information obtained from this in determining
 whether a Bidder is a responsible Bidder.
- 29. ASBESTOS AND FORMALDEHYDE STATEMENT: All building materials, pressed boards, and furniture supplied to SBBC shall be 100% asbestos free. It is desirous that all building materials, pressed boards and furniture supplied to SBBC also be 100% formaldehyde free. Bidder, by virtue of bidding, certifies by signing bid that, if awarded this bid, only building materials, pressed boards, and/or furniture that is 100% asbestos free shall be supplied.
- 30. <u>ASSIGNMENT:</u> Neither any award of this bid nor any interest in any award of this bid may be assigned, transferred or encumbered by any party without the prior written consent from the Director, Procurement and Warehousing Services. There shall be no partial assignments of this ITB including, without limitation, the partial assignment of any right to receive payments from SBBC.
- 31. EXTENSION: In addition to any extension options contained herein, SBBC is granted the right to extend any award resulting from this bid for the period of time necessary for SBBC to release, award and implement a replacement bid for the goods, products and/or services provided through this bid. Such extension shall be upon the same prices, terms and conditions as existing at the time of SBBC's exercise of this extension right. The period of any extension under this provision shall not be for a period in excess of six months from (a) the termination date of a contract entered into as a result of this bid or (b) the termination date under any applicable period of extension under a contract entered into as a result of this bid.
- 32. OMISSION FROM THE SPECIFICATIONS: The apparent silence of this specification and any Addendum regarding any details or the omission from the specification of a detailed description concerning any point shall be regarded as meaning that only the best available units shall be provided and the best commercial practices are to prevail, and that only materials and workmanship of first quality are to be used. All interpretations of this specification shall be made upon the basis of this agreement.
- 33. SUBMITTAL OF INVOICES: All Bidders are hereby notified that any invoice submitted as a result of the award of this bid must be in the same format as any Purchase Order released as a result of the award of this bid. Each line of the invoice must reference a corresponding single line shown on the Purchase Order. A single invoice line must not correspond to or commingle the cost shown on multiple Purchase Order lines. An invoice submitted that does not follow the same format and line numbering as shown on the Purchase Order shall be deemed to be not correct, and may be returned to the vendor by the Accounts Payable Department for correction. Address for submitting invoices is included on Purchase Order.
- 34. PURCHASE AGREEMENT: This bid and the corresponding Purchase Orders shall constitute the complete agreement. SBBC shall not accept proposed terms and conditions that are different than those contained in this Invitation to Bid, including preprinted text contained on catalogs, price lists, other descriptive information submitted or any other materials. By virtue of submitting a bid, Awardee agrees to not submit to any SBBC employee, for signature, any document that contains terms and conditions that are different than those contained herein and that in the event any document containing any term or condition that differs from those contained herein is executed, said document shall not be binding on SBBC.

- 48. <u>DISTRIBUTION</u>: Demand Star by Onvia, <u>www.demandstar.com</u>, is the official method approved by Procurement and Warehousing Services for the distribution of all competitive solicitations including ITBs and RFPs. Such rights shall be exercised with notice to the Awardee to determine compliance with and performance of the terms, conditions and specifications on all matters, rights and duties, and obligations established by this agreement. Documents/records in any form shall be open to the District or State's representative and may include but are not limited to all correspondence, ordering, payment, inspection, and receiving records, contracts or subcontracts that directly or indirectly pertain to the transactions between the District and the Awardee(s).
- 56. <u>ORIGINAL DOCUMENT FORMAT:</u> Only the terms and conditions of this solicitation as they were released by SBBC, or amended via Addendum, are valid. Any modification to any term or condition by a Bidder is not binding unless it is expressly agreed to, in writing, by SBBC.
- 57. CREDIT CARDS: Individual schools and departments may place some orders and utilize, as the form of payment, a District-issued credit card to the extent authorized by SBBC. These orders shall be made via phone or fax for direct delivery and billing to the requesting work location. Please note that credit card purchases will benefit all vendors by providing immediate payment (i.e. within 48-72 hours), thereby eliminating the need to submit an invoice to the District's Accounts Payable Department or reconcile receivable balances. MEET OR RELEASE: If during the contract term, SBBC is offered a lower price from a third party supplier for a product or service awarded under this contract, or offers another item that meets or exceeds the specifications for the item at a lower price than the awarded price, SBBC shall request Awardee to meet the lower price offered by the third party supplier. Awardee shall be required to respond to this request within three (3) days of request. If Awardee is unable to meet the lower price, SBBC shall be released from its contractual obligation to purchase the item under this contract. No response to this request shall indicate that Awardee is unable to offer item at a lower price. This action, purchasing awarded item from third party supplier, shall not hold SBBC in default of contract. Each purchase shall be considered separate and apart from each other.
- 63. <u>CONFIDENTIAL RECORDS:</u> Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary within this Contract, any party contracting with SBBC under this Contract shall fully comply with the requirements of Sections 1002.22 and 1002.221, Florida Statutes; Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), and any other state or federal law or regulation regarding the confidentiality of student information and records. Each such party agrees, for itself, its officers, employees, agents, representatives, contractors or subcontractors, to fully indemnify and hold harmless SBBC and its officers and employees for any violation of this section, including, without limitation, defending SBBC and its officers and employee against any complaint, administrative or judicial proceeding, payment of any penalty imposed upon SBBC, or payment of any and all costs, damages, judgments or losses incurred by or imposed upon SBBC arising out of a breach of this covenant by the party, or an officer, employee, agent, representative, contractor of the party to the extent that the party or an officer, employee, agent, representative, contractor, or sub-contractor, or sub-contractor of the party shall either intentionally or negligently violate the provisions of this section or of Sections 1002.22 and/or 1002.221, Florida Statutes.

Awardee agrees that it may create, receive from or on behalf of SBBC, or have access to, records or record systems that are subject to FERPA and/or HIPAA (collectively, the "Confidential Records"). Awardee represents, warrants, and agrees that it shall: (1) hold the Confidential Records in strict confidence and shall not use or disclose the Confidential Records except as (a) permitted or required by this Agreement, (b) required by law, or (c) otherwise authorized by the SBBC in writing; (2) safeguard the Confidential Records according to commercially reasonable administrative, physical and technical standards as required by law; and (3) continually monitor its operations and take any and all action necessary to assure that the Confidential Records are safeguarded in accordance with the terms of this Agreement. At the request of the SBBC, Awardee agrees to provide SBBC with a written summary of the procedures Awardee uses to safeguard the Confidential Records. A breach of these confidentiality requirements shall constitute grounds for the SBBC to terminate any Agreement with Awardee.

64. PROPRIETARY INFORMATION: Pursuant to Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, bids received as a result of this ITB shall not become public record until thirty (30) days after the date of opening or until posting of the recommendation for award, whichever occurs first. Thereafter, all bid documents or other materials submitted by all Bidders in response to this ITB shall be open for inspection by any person and in accordance with Chapter 119, Florida Statutes. To the extent a Bidder asserts any portion of its bid is confidential and exempt, long with specific citations of the Florida Statutes establishing the confidentiality or exemption. Failure to identify the portions of the bid claimed to be exempt or the specific statutory authority establishing the exemption shall be deemed a waiver by the Bidder that any unidentified portion of the bid is confidential or exempt from disclosure under Chapter 119, Florida Statutes.

Should a public records request for bid documents or other materials submitted by a Bidder be submitted, SBBC shall notify the contact person identified in the bid of the request in writing. The notice provided shall indicate that requested materials shall be produced unless, within ten (10) calendar days of the date of the written notification, the Awardee initiated an action in a court of competent jurisdiction to obtain an injunction or protective order prohibiting the release of the requested materials. Awardee shall name the party requesting the materials as a defendant and shall not name SBBC as a party to the action. Awardee agrees to hold SBBC harmless from any award to a plaintiff for damages, costs or attorney's fees based on nondisclosure of information asserted to be confidential and exempt. Failure to timely initiate the action shall be deemed a waiver by the Awardee that the requested information is confidential and exempt. Awardee agrees to waive any cause of action it may have against SBBC for the release of materials pursuant to a public records request except those based on the intentional or grossly negligent conduct of any employee of SBBC. Submission by a Bidder in response to this ITB shall be deemed as Bidder's consent to the foregoing conditions.

SECTION 4, SPECIAL CONDITIONS

1. INTRODUCTION AND SCOPE:

The School Board of Broward County, Florida (hereinafter referred to as "SBBC") desires bids on **Portable Two Way Radios**, **Repeaters and Accessories** as specified herein. The scope of requirements includes the purchase, programming and warranty repair service of radios.

- 2. <u>TERM:</u> The award of this bid shall establish a contract for the period beginning March 1, 2017 or date of award, whichever is later through February 28, 2020.
- 3. <u>AWARD:</u> This Bid will be awarded into seven groups. Group 1, Total Low Group Items A through 1C, Group 2, Total Low Group Items 2A & 2B, Group 3, Total Low Group, Items 3A through 3BB, Group 4, Total Low Group, Items 4A through 4F, Group 5, Total Low Group Items 5A & 5B, Group 6, Item 6A, and Group 7, Items 7A & 7B, Total Low Group. Vendors are required to complete the Bid Summary Sheet for all items listed. <u>If any item is left blank for any group, the vendor will be considered non responsive for that group.</u> If there is no charge for an item, the bidder should clearly state this or note zero dollars. Awardees who submit multiple prices for a single line item offered will be disqualified. Parties must bid on all items in each group to be considered for that group.

In order to meet the needs of SBBC, items shall be awarded **BY GROUP** to one primary bidder and up to two alternate responsive and responsible bidders meeting specifications, terms and conditions. The lowest Awardee for an item or group shall be considered the primary vendor and should receive the largest volume of work. Therefore, it is necessary to bid on every item in the group, and all items in the group must meet specifications in order to have its bid considered for award. Unit prices must be stated in the space provided on the Bid Summary Sheet. SBBC reserves the right to procure goods from the second lowest bidder if **a**) the primary Bidder cannot comply with delivery requirements or specifications; **b**) the lowest Bidder is not in compliance with delivery requirements or specifications on current or previous orders; **c**) in cases of emergency; or **d**) if it is in the best interest of SBBC. When a bid has both a primary and alternate Awardees, and the primary Awardee is unable to perform during the term of the contract, Procurement and Warehousing Services shall negotiate with the alternate Awardees for the same or lower unit prices as those submitted by the primary Awardee.

After award of this bid, any Awardee who violates any specification, terms or condition of this bid can be found in default of its contract, have its contract canceled, be subject to the payment of liquidated damages, and be removed from the bid list and not be eligible to do business with SBBC for two years, as described in General Conditions 21 and 58.

- 4. <u>INFORMATION:</u> Any questions by prospective Bidders concerning this Invitation to Bid should be addressed to Karlene Grant, Procurement and Warehousing Services, e-mail at karlene.grant@browardschools.com who is authorized only to direct the attention of prospective Bidders to various portions of the bid so they may read and interpret such for themselves. Deadline for questions shall be December 23, 2016 at 5:00 p.m. ET. Questions should be submitted in accordance with General Condition 5. Interpretations of the bid or additional information as to its requirements, where necessary, shall be communicated to Bidders only by written Addendum. Any verbal or written information, which is obtained other than by information in this ITB document or by Addenda, shall not be binding on SBBC.
- 5. CONTRACT RENEWAL: The purpose of this bid is to establish a contract, at firm unit prices, for the purchase of estimated requirements for the items listed. The term of the bid shall be for three (3) year(s), and may, by mutual agreement between SBBC and the Awardee, be renewed for two additional one-year periods and, if needed, 90 days beyond the expiration date of the final renewal period. Procurement and Warehousing Services, will, if considering renewing, request a letter of intent to renew from Awardee, prior to the end of the current contract period. The Awardee shall be notified when the recommendation has been acted upon by the School Board. All prices shall be firm through the contract period or specified in Special Condition 14 for the term of the contract. The Bidder(s) agrees to this condition by signing its bid.
- 6. <u>DELIVERY:</u> Bidder is to indicate, in the space provided on the Bid Summary Sheet, delivery time required for each bid item. A Bidder who fails to indicate delivery time agrees to deliver items ordered within 20 days from the receipt of the order (ARO).

- 7. **QUANTITIES:** The quantities listed on the Bid Summary Sheet are estimated quantities to be ordered throughout the contract period for each item and are not a guarantee. Actual quantities ordered throughout the contract period may be greater or less than the bid estimates and shall be furnished at the fixed contract price. Purchases will be requested as needed throughout the contract period and as few as one each may be ordered at one time.
- 8. **ADDING OR DELETING SITES:** SBBC may, during the term of the contract, add or delete license, wholly or in part, at any SBBC site.
- 9. MANUFACTURER APPROVAL: In accordance with SBBC Policy 3320, Part I, Rules, bids will be accepted only on the manufacturer specified in order for schools and locations to be consistent with the system currently in place. All equipment from the same manufacturer is required so that interchangeability (antennas, batteries, cables, etc.) can be accomplished. In addition to selling of the specified radios, awardee should be able to provide local service for troubleshooting of radio problems at school sites. Awardee should be able to make repairs, or arrange for depot repairs, on all types of existing Motorola radios that may be in service under warranty at the school sites in addition to the specified radios in this bid. Warranty repairs shall be made at no cost to SBBC and loaner equipment must be made available for all warranty repairs that require more than three working days to repair. Repairs for out-of-warranty radios, repeaters, etc. will be performed under a separate contract.
- 10. **COMPANY REPRESENTATIVE:** Bidder(s) should indicate the name, address, telephone number, etc., of the representative who could make scheduled visits to the SBBC and who shall be available, upon request, to resolve billing and/or other issues.
- 11. <u>FORCE MAJEURE:</u> Except for the provisions of this bid, each party shall be excused from performance under this bid only for such period of time as the failure to perform is caused by or attributable to any event or circumstance beyond the direct control of such party. It is further provided that if either party shall fail to make any delivery or perform any service required by this bid as a result of any such event or circumstances beyond its own direct control, it shall have the right to make such delivery or perform such service within a reasonable time after the cause of such delay has been removed, and the other party shall accept such deferred delivery or performance.
- 12. <u>FORMS REQUIRED:</u> ALL BIDDERS MUST COMPLETE AND SUBMIT THE ATTACHMENTS TO BE CONSIDERED FOR AWARD.
 - 1. Disclosure of Potential Conflict of Interest and Conflicting Employment or Contractual Relationship
 - 2. Drug-Free Workplace
 - 3. Insurance Requirements (With the Bid or within 15 days after award notification)
 - 4. W 9 Form
 - 5. Certification of Debarment, Suspension, Ineligibility and Voluntary Exclusion Lower Tier Transactions

13. <u>INVOICES</u>: Delivery of invoice copies to SBBC MUST include the items listed below to permit SBBC to verify prices with this contract and expedite the use of material. FAILURE OF AN AWARDEE TO PROVIDE THIS INFORMATION SHALL RESULT IN EITHER THE INVOICE BEING RETURNED FOR CLARIFICATION OR A DELAY IN PROCESSING SAID INVOICE FOR PAYMENT. Invoices are to be mailed to Accounts Payable, 600 SE 3rd Avenue 7th Floor, Fort Lauderdale, Florida 33301.

Please include the following on all invoices:

- B. Complete description of the software
- C Part I numbers, if applicable
- D. Itemized list prices
- E. Serial number
- 14. PRICE ADJUSTMENTS: Unit prices offered shall remain firm for the first three (3) years of the contract and shall be evaluated on an annual basis thereafter, not exceeding 3%. A request for price adjustment with proper documented justification shall be submitted in writing and must have written approval from SBBC prior to invoicing. Any unit price adjustment invoiced without written approval from SBBC shall not be paid and the invoice returned to the Awardee for correction.
- 15. **REPAIRS:** The Awardee shall maintain responsibility for all repair and warranty repair work performed. Awardee will coordinate with the schools to pick up their portable two way radios directly at a SBBC location for repairs, with no charge being incurred by SBBC for the delivery or pickup. Awardee may be contacted by phone and/or email, whichever is opportune at that time, and should collect the radio within two (2) business days of being notified. Repairs for repeaters and mobile radios may be serviced at the site location if needed. Awardee shall be completely and solely responsible for the coordination and completion of all repairs.
- 16. PRODUCT SUPPORT: SBBC will select specific radios and equipment that will be allowed to be purchased from catalogs submitted to Procurement and Warehousing Services and Information and Technology Departments. Upon request from the Procurement and Warehousing Services and Information and Technology Departments (ONLY), awardee will be required to submit repair/maintenance/operators' manuals at no additional cost to a requested location. Radios and equipment, when delivered, will include appropriate safety warnings regarding use of radio service/equipment provided.
- MARRANTY: Manufacturer's warranty shall be extended to SBBC for all bid and catalog items. Awardee, through the equipment manufacturer, shall fully warranty the cost of parts and labor for a period of three (3) years for all radios and equipment after date of delivery, installation, and acceptance at no additional charge to SBBC; all other accessory items shall be one (1) year. Radios must be durable enough to withstand being dropped or having a knob control fall off and shall be covered under this warranty. In the event of a dispute on requested repairs between SBBC and the Awardee, the decision of SBBC shall be final and binding on both parties. If the manufacturer's stated warranty is greater, the manufacturer's warranty shall prevail and must be provided to SBBC. While products are under warranty, it will be the responsibility of each Awardee to furnish telephone technical support. All extended warranties provided shall be comparable, in full, to the manufacturer's warranty. Warranty period may exceed term of this contract based on the date the radio was purchased and Awardee shall be completely responsible for warranty repairs. SBBC has been notified by Motorola that resellers should contact their CSM for warranty pricing.
- 18. <u>VENDOR SOLICITATION</u>: All vendors are required to have approval by Procurement Warehousing Services to introduce new products to schools' sites or SBBC locations. Vendors must have prior approval before entering school locations for solicitation purposes.

- 19. M/WBE UTILIZATION REPORTING: In an effort to monitor the achievement of the M/WBE goal the Awardee(s) agrees to submit, a completed Monthly M/WBE Utilization Report form, attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and made a part of this contract. The timing of these reports must coincide with invoice submission. In addition to the M/WBE Utilization Report form, Awardee(s) shall also provide proof of payment made to each M/WBE Subcontractor which shall take the form of cancelled checks or check register photocopies, or any other valid form of documentation that serves to substantiate all payment amounts included in the Subcontractor Utilization Report. The Awardee(s) understands that each M/WBE utilized for the contract must be certified by SBBC, Supplier Diversity & Outreach Program Office.
- 20. FREQUENCY SELECTION AND PROGRAMMING: Radios shall be delivered with all frequency and operational features installed (or programmed) and ready to operate. Awardee must test the system at the location for any interference for frequency selection problems and correct any deficiencies at that time. The cost of this programming shall be included in the unit price of the equipment. Upon receipt of a purchase order, Awardee must contact SBBC's Information & Technology, telephone 754-321-0349. Awardee must directly implement any changes, corrections or credits to SBBC to select license frequencies before programming the frequency on the specified radio(s). SBBC's Information & Technology maintains the Federal Communication Commission Radio Station License for Broward County Public Schools. If radio ID's are required, (all sites with digital programmed channels) the vendor must contact the appropriate IT staff to obtain the ID's specific site before delivery. Failure to properly program a radio with the correct approved ID, will result in the vendor returning to SBBC's site to correct the programming error.
- 21. **RE-PROGRAMMING OF RADIOS:** Bidder is to state on the Bid Summary Sheet the cost to re-program radio frequencies. This is for informational purposes only and will not be used in the evaluation of the bid. Reprogramming of radios due to the fault of the Awardee shall result in no cost to SBBC.
- 22. **SOFTWARE REQUIREMENTS**: Awardee must provide a free Customer Programming Software subscription for the duration of the bid plus one year and a hard copy (as requested) of the complete radio system software (CPS) for each model of radio offered to SBBC upon request. This is to include software updates to CPS software issued. This software should include, but not be limited to, frequency programming and radio feature programming information. Software shall be compatible with Windows XP, VISTA and Windows 7, 8 & 10 operating systems. Operating systems must be backward software compatible as well. Awardee must have the CPS subscription in SBBC's name and orders must be done utilizing the existing SBBC Motorola Customer number so that the above mentioned software is accessible by appropriate SBBC staff at any time. SBBC will rely on the reseller to verify that SBBC is utilizing compatible software.
- 23. <u>REPEATER AND ANTENNA INSTALLATION:</u> Upon request, Awardee shall provide repeater and antenna installation services to various locations. Bidder is to provide the cost per installation in the space provided. Bidder shall arrange for the installation of the repeater and antenna within five (5) working days after a request from SBBC. A SBBC building permit is required for all repeater installations. It is incumbent upon the awarded vendor(s) to ensure that all work being done is performed by a certified technician.

The location as to where the repeater is to be installed within a building will be determined by SBBC designee and must be installed in a communication closet as close as possible to the antenna to minimize cable line loss. The installation of the repeater and antenna must be completed within two (2) days after start of work. The antenna and the repeater must be installed in the same building.

REPEATER AND ANTENNA INSTALLATION (Continued):

For multi-building sites, the antenna will be installed on a six-foot mast on the roof of the building closest to the center of the site. The mast is a piece of pipe mounted to the side of the building that will secure the antenna. The mast shall protrude higher than the rooftop. Installation of antenna cable will not be allowed penetrating the roof. Penetrations in exterior walls or existing roof penetrations for installation of cables will only be acceptable. All installations shall be performed according to manufacturer's recommendations and shall follow standard engineering practices. For example, cable penetrations through walls are to be sealed and watertight. All interior cable is to be plenum rated. UPS's provided as part of this item must be network manageable and be capable of providing power for a minimum of 20 minutes run time at 60% use. The proposed battery backup solution should be capable of SNMP, remote management and diagnostics (available from a central location with the SBBC network). All repeater mounting brackets are to be securely fastened to walls or network 19" equipment racks. Installation cost shall include installation of the repeater, mast, antenna, duplexer, alternating current (a/c) surge protector/battery backup, polyphaser surge protection, grounding and any additional components required to complete installation as per Florida building code and SBBC Facilities and Construction Department. Awardee is responsible for completion of any work found to be inferior by SBBC Building Department Inspectors. To obtain a SBBC building permit, Awardee is responsible for submitting four (4) copies of certified and stamped electrical and structural drawings (no smaller than 11"x17") to SBBC, Information & Technology Department, 7720 West Oakland Park Blvd., 2nd Floor, Sunrise, Florida 33351 which will then complete a building permit application and submit it to SBBC's Building Department for plan review and issuance of a SBBC Building Permit. All work is to be completed utilizing the most recent Florida Building code and must pass appropriate inspections from SBBC's Building Department. For example, in the current Fifth Edition (2014) of the Florida Building Code, Broward County is in a Risk Category III and IV area. Awardee is responsible for scheduling the post installation inspection and all subsequent inspections. Awardee must provide SBBC, Information & Technology Department a copy of the signed building permit and passed inspections, prior to the processing of any invoice for payment. In some instances, a new or modified FCC license will be required. That item awardee shall apply for such license including any and all frequency coordination required, on behalf of SBBC. The cost of all components of the repeater installation must be itemized by line on the proposal and the invoice. The repeater serial number must be clearly indicated on the invoice which must include the date, purchase order number, invoice number, room number equipment was installed and the signature of the person at the installation location acknowledging the installation has been completed and the equipment is working properly. The proposal should also include the cost of reprogramming all existing portable radios on the site, if applicable.

25. <u>DISCONTINUED/SUBSTITUTION</u>: Manufacturer of item awarded may modify its product line and may need to make substitution offerings to SBBC during the term of the contract. Awardee is required to notify SBBC that manufacturer's item awarded is scheduled for discontinuation and will no longer be available for purchase. <u>This notification must be submitted in writing and must be received in SBBC's Procurement and Warehousing Services Department at least 60 days prior to the effective discontinuation date, or within five days after Awardee is notified by manufacturer of the discontinued item</u>. This written notification must also state the substitution item that is being offered by the manufacturer. Each specification of the substitute item must meet or exceed those specifications listed in the bid for the awarded item. Awardee is to submit complete descriptive literature, including schematics, operational and service manuals and parts lists on the proposed replacement item. Failure to provide this information and the notification within the timeframe stated above will cause the Awardee to be in noncompliance of contract and may result in default of contract. SBBC reserves the right, during this 30-day advance notice period, to continue to order the item scheduled for discontinuation with the requirement that all such orders are filled as originally placed prior to the substitution being offered, or to purchase the newer, submitted item. SBBC reserves the right to reject any item offered as a substitution and require Awardee to re-submit another item supplied by same manufacturer for substitution.

- ADDITIONAL PRICING (BALANCE OF LINE): The items listed on the Bid Summary Sheets are indicative of the minimum system configurations currently procured by SBBC in each of the portable and mobile radio groups. Bidders are encouraged, in their ITB response, to list a single percentage discount level that applies to all the items listed. This percentage discount will establish the discount level that will be applied to all future pricing for items procured by SBBC from the Awardee as a result of the award of this ITB. SBBC reserves the right to modify the technical specifications from those stated on the System Specifications noted in this ITB at any time and for any item procured from the Awardee. Bidder must submit a copy of the published retail price list or URL form which the price offered and the percentage were calculated upon request. The price offered in bid must be equivalent to the list/retail price on the submitted price list or URL less the offered percentage discount.
- 27. CATALOGS/PRICE LIST(S) Balance of Line (Special Condition 26): Bidder(s) may furnish, with the bid or upon request, one copy of their current radio electronic catalog(s)/price list(s) for Motorola products only, which will indicate all items bidder can furnish and the list prices to be used for each item. Any electronic catalogs/price lists and bids submitted for other than Motorola Radios, Equipment and Accessories will not be accepted. Catalogs submitted must contain UHF High Band radios with a minimum range of 420MHz. Catalogs are only to be submitted to the Supply Management and Logistics Department, 7720 W. Oakland Park Boulevard, Suite 323, Sunrise, Florida 33351-6704. If, during the contract period, the Awardee issues replacements to the catalog(s) a copy of the replacement catalog(s)/price list(s) is to be forwarded only to: The Procurement Warehousing Services Department, 7720 W. Oakland Park Boulevard, Suite 323, Sunrise, Florida 33351-6704.
- 28. **NEW EQUIPMENT:** Bids shall be for new equipment; i.e. units that have not been previously used in any way and are being actively marketed by the bidder. Minor parts within the machine may have remanufactured components. Therefore, reconditioned, refurbished, rebuilt, discontinued, used, shop worn, demonstrator, prototype equipment or other radios of this kind are not acceptable and will be rejected.
- 29. LICENSE AND INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS: Awardee hereby grants to SBBC and all authorized users hereunder an irrevocable, perpetual, nonexclusive, worldwide, fully paid up, royalty-free license and/or sublicense to (i) use, execute, maintain, reproduce, modify, display, perform, and distribute copies of such Intellectual Property; and (ii) authorize others to do any or all of the foregoing. SBBC will copy any of the software as necessary to efficiently utilize the software. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, such rights shall include copying rights granted to "owners of copies" under federal copyright laws of the United States, plus copying: (I) for backup, archive or emergency restart purposes; (ii) to replace worn copies; (iii) to understand the contents of machine readable materials; (iv) to migrate the software for use on other computers and/or hardware; and (v) to store the software at any off premise location which SBBC uses for storage purposes.
- 30. INSPECTIONS AND TESTING: SBBC will have the right to inspect and test any of the goods at work covered by this ITB. All goods or services are subject to SBBC's inspection and approval upon arrival or completion. Such inspection, or the waiver thereof, however, will not relieve the Awardee from full responsibility for furnishing goods or work conforming to the requirements of this ITB or the ITB Specifications, and will not prejudice any claim, right, or privilege SBBC will have because of the use of defective or unsatisfactory goods or work.
- 31. WARRANTY OF CURRENCY: SBBC includes the Warranty of Currency in this ITB to protect itself from unknowingly acquiring technology that is at the end of its production, support, and/or marketing life cycle. The intent of this Special Condition is to ensure that SBBC continuously acquires newly manufactured equipment that is currently in production and to require that the Awardee notify, in writing, SBBC of generational upgrades of the product line they sell to SBBC, prior to the sale and delivery of equipment under the terms of this ITB. This will ensure that SBBC is able to make the best purchasing decisions not only based on what SBBC purchases, but also based on when the purchases are made.
- 32. MOBILE RADIO INSTALLATION: Upon request, Awardee shall provide installation of mobile radios on various SBBC vehicles or buses. Bidder is to provide the cost per mobile radio installation in the space provided on the Bid Summary Sheet under Additional Information Required. These vehicles shall remain on SBBC's property during installation.

In the cases below, the following person must give Form W-9 to the partnership for purposes of establishing its U.S. status and avoiding withholding on its allocable share of not income from the partnership conducting a trade or business in the United States:

- In the case of a disregarded entity with a U.S. owner, the U.S. owner of the disregarded entity and not the entity,
- In the case of a grantor trust with a U.S. grantor or other U.S. owner, generally, the U.S. grantor or other U.S. owner of the grantor trust and not the trust, and
- In the case of a U.S. trust (other than a grantor trust), the U.S. trust (other than a grantor trust) and not the beneficiaries of the trust.

Foreign person. If you are a foreign person or the U.S. branch of a foreign bank that has elected to be treated as a U.S. person, do not use Form W-9. Instead, use the appropriate Form W-8 or Form 8233 (see Publication 515, Withholding of Tax on Nonresident Aliens and Foreign Entities).

Nonresident alien who becomes a resident alien. Generally, only a nonresident alien individual may use the terms of a tax treaty to reduce or eliminate U.S. tax on certain types of income. However, most tax treaties contain a provision known as a "saving clause." Exceptions specified in the saving clause may permit an examption from tax to continue for certain types of income even after the payee has otherwise become a U.S. resident alien for tax purposes.

If you are a U.S. resident alien who is relying on an exception contained in the saving clause of a tax treaty to claim an exemption from U.S. tax on certain types of income, you must attach a statement to Form W-9 that specifies the following five items:

- The treaty country. Generally, this must be the same treaty under which you claimed exemption from tax as a nonresident alien.
- 2. The treaty article addressing the income.
- The article number (or location) in the tax treaty that contains the saving clause and its exceptions.
- 4. The type and amount of income that qualifies for the exemption from tax.
- Sufficient facts to justify the exemption from tax under the terms of the treaty article.

Example. Article 20 of the U.S.-China income tax treaty allows an exemption from tax for scholarship income received by a Chinese student temporarily present in the United States. Under U.S. law, this student will become a resident alien for tax purposes if his or her stay in the United States exceeds 5 calendar years. However, paragraph 2 of the first Protocol to the U.S.-China treaty (dated April 30, 1984) allows the provisions of Article 20 to continue to apply even after the Chinese student becomes a resident alien of the United States. A Chinese student who qualifies for this exception (under paragraph 2 of the first protocol) and is relying on this exception to claim an exemption from tax on his or her scholarship or fellowship income would attach to Form W-9 a statement that includes the information described above to support that exemption.

If you are a nonresident alien or a foreign entity, give the requester the appropriate completed Form W-8 or Form 8233.

What is backup withholding? Persons making certain payments to you must under certain conditions withhold and pay to the IRS a percentage of such payments. This is called "backup withholding." Payments that may be subject to backup withholding include interest, tax-exempt interest, dividends, broker and barter exchange transactions, rents, royalties, nonemployee pay, payments made in settlement of payment card and third party network transactions, and certain payments from fishing boat operators. Real estate transactions are not subject to backup withholding.

You will not be subject to backup withholding on payments you receive if you give the requester your correct TIN, make the proper certifications, and report all your taxable interest and dividends on your tax return.

#### Payments you receive will be subject to backup withholding if:

- 1. You do not furnish your TIN to the requester,
- You do not certify your TIN when required (see the Part II instructions on page 3 for details),
- 3. The IRS tells the requester that you furnished an incorrect TIN,

### Updating Your Information

You must provide updated information to any person to whom you claimed to be an exempt payee if you are no longer an exempt payee and anticipate receiving reportable payments in the future from this person. For example, you may need to provide updated information if you are a C corporation that elects to be an S corporation, or if you no longer are tax exampt. In addition, you must furnish a new Form W-9 if the name or TIN changes for the account, for example, if the grantor of a grantor frust dies.

#### Penalties

Failure to furnish TIN. If you fall to furnish your correct TIN to a requester, you are subject to a penalty of \$50 for each such failure unless your failure is due to reasonable cause and not to willful neglect.

Civil penalty for false information with respect to withholding. If you make a false statement with no reasonable basis that results in no backup withholding, you are subject to a \$500 penalty.

Disregarded entity. For U.S. federal tax purposes, an entity that is disregarded as an entity separate from its owner is treated as a "disregarded entity." See Regulation section 301.7701-2[c](2](iii). Enter the owner's name on the "Name" line. The name of the entity entired on the "Name" line should never be a disregarded entity. The name on the "Name" line must be the name shown on the income tax return on which the income should be reported. For example, if a foreign LLC that is treated as a disregarded entity for U.S. federal tax purposes has a single owner that is a U.S. person, the U.S. owner's name is required to be provided on the "Name" line. If the direct owner of the entity is also a disregarded entity, enter the first owner that is not disregarded for federal tax purposes. If the LLC is disregarded as an entity separate from its owner, enter the appropriate tax classification of the owner identified on the "Name" line.

For interest and dividend payments, and certain payments must with respect to readily tradable instruments, generally you will have 60 days to get a TIN and give it to the requester before you are subject to backup withholding on payments. The 60-day rule does not apply to other types of payments. You will be subject to backup withholding on all such payments until you provide your TIN to the requester.

Note. Entering "Applied For" means that you have already applied for a TIN or that you intend to apply for one soon.

Caution: A disregarded U.S. entity that has a foreign owner must use the appropriate Form W-8.

#### Part II. Certification
