1. **Call Meeting to Order** Mrs. Weaver calls the meeting to order at 3:09 pm
2. **Approve Meeting Minutes from September 25, 2018** Mrs. Gilman approves last month's minutes. Motion was second by Mrs. Miranda
3. **Voting for SAC Members** Mrs. Weaver asks if anyone would like to hold various open positions within the School Advisory Council.
 - a. No current held positions were vacated. Present members unanimously voted to keep current members and to have Angela Maple serve as the new SAF representative along with Tricia Allen Osborne serve as the new I-Zone representative for CSHS.
4. **School Improvement Plan (SIP) Updates by Principal and Departments**
 - Guidance- Eric Belliard - College fairs are ongoing for students. Currently the dept. is working on FAFSA with the seniors to get them prepared for college. Still getting all students familiar with Naviance as well.
 - Reading/Writing – Anita Parsotan – Continuing with the book fair. Collaborating with the Miami book fair as well. The students had the opportunity to meet authors and interview them. The dept recently started a senior reading mentoring program attempting to improve reading scores for struggling seniors.
 - Math – Denise Miranda – PSAT scores were taken a few weeks ago, waiting for scores to come back in to link their results with Khan academy for remediation. All teachers are using online practice tools to remediate their students: ex. USA test prep and Algebra Nation. Common assessments are still being given within subjects.
 - Science – Vamini Ramkissoon – Teachers are still working on Biology EOC curriculum. Teachers are on schedule to complete all topics. Once they are finished with the curriculum, they will start reviewing for the biology EOC. Students will take a mock exam and be evaluated based on their practice scores. The dept is increasing literacy using science articles. The department also received new text books.
 - Principal Updates – Vivian Suarez – Enforcing literacy across all curriculums. If they can master upper level reading, they can be successful in all courses. Reading classes are completing silent sustained reading to increase their reading stamina. Congratulations to the Marching Colts on their accomplishments this past weekend.

The band received straight Superior ratings. The Harvest Drive is starting as well. It consists of collecting food and necessities for families to be distributed during Thanksgiving week. The new SAF chair will attend the area meeting tomorrow morning. NCAA eligibility night is this Thursday. Cross Country had districts today along with the Swim Team. The faculty received an active killer training last Friday. Hopefully you have been using the safety mobile app. The single point of entry should be completed by January 2019 per the district. The class of 2018 donated the new desk in the front office.

5. New Business

- SIP update – Mrs. Weaver – SIP was completed and is in place with the district. She will update throughout the year to properly document activities.
- Accountability Funds Vote – Tutoring – Use of funds to pay teachers to assist students and better prepare them for their respective EOC exams. This has been a cost-effective use of the accountability funds. There is a surplus that carried over from last year of \$5,000. Members unanimously vote to use the funds for teachers.
