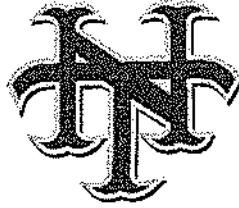

- I. Welcome 5:22
 - A. Mr. Forbes calls the meeting to order; quorum has been met. He notes that this year the SAC Chair and Co-Chair ran unopposed.
- II. Adopt September Meeting Minutes 5:25
 - A. Mr. Forbes motions to adopt the September meeting minutes
 - B. Ms. Kwak motions to approve
 - C. Seconded by Ms. Cerone
 - D. Motion passes
- III. School Improvement Plan: Social and Emotional Learning Plan 5:27
 - A. Mr. Andre presents information about the School Improvement Plan. He describes how Nova High School is striving to help students improve their mental health through the Social Emotional Learning Plan. Clubs such as Hope Sunshine and Best Buddies are spreading messages of positivity and creating atmospheres of openness and acceptance; the “mobile guidance” initiative is encouraging students to speak with administration during lunch; the Weight of Words performance is continuing to educate students on the impact of what they say and whom they say it to.
- IV. Dual Enrollment 5:30
 - A. Mr. Andre discusses Dual Enrollment at Nova High School. He notes that the program allows high school students to earn college credits at Broward Community College, McFatter Technical School, or Florida Atlantic University. Students must be intellectually and emotionally ready to meet the challenges of college. A 3.0 GPA and certain test scores are required; all information can be found on Naviance. Students receive a schedule with a mixture of high school and college classes; they can still play sports and participate in clubs at Nova High. Early Admission at Broward College allows successful students to graduate high school with an Associate’s Degree. They are able to take as many college courses as they pass them.
- V. School Improvement Plan: Professional Study Days and Professional Development 6:02
 - A. Mr. Forbes continues with information about Professional Study Days at Nova High School. For the first Thursday of nearly every month, students are released at 12:30 and teachers are able to complete professional development. This is especially helpful to new teachers and is a great opportunity to use data from assessments to modify the curriculum. Mr. Forbes reviews a detailed Powerpoint on the Professional Study Day goals on PSD days.

VI. Principal's Report 6:11

- A. Ms. Sexton fills in for Dr. LaCasse for the Principal's Report. Saturday Academy has started. Buses pick students up on Saturdays and take them to Nova for additional help in math, reading, and SAT prep. This program is run by Dr. Cox.
- B. Students will now be required to wear their ID badge at all times on campus as part of new safety and security measures being implemented by the district.
- C. The Stay Woke Teen Summit is approaching, where Trayvon Martin's parents will be speaking to students who attend the event.

 - A. Ms. Shirley explains the literacy/reading initiatives being taken to improve reading scores in students to achieve the goal of getting every 10th grader to pass the FSA with at least a three. Some of which include:
