November 28, 2018**

1. Meeting was called to order at 2:32 P.M.
2. The minutes were approved. Motioned by Mrs. Fabricio and seconded by Mrs. Diaz.
3. The agenda was approved. Motioned by Mrs. Diaz and seconded by Ms. Linero. With correction made to the next meeting date, of January 23, 2019.
4. New Business:
  - A+ Ballot voted on by the staff; 100% choice A, by staff and 30% choice B voted by the staff. Funds will be distributed by the next payroll period of December 7<sup>th</sup> or December 14<sup>th</sup>, A/B payroll.
5. Quorum not established, skipping voting for funding camp.
6. Principal's Report
  - C.I.A. camp is scheduled to begin February 2019, due to testing being in April/May 2019. All test are now paper based and not computerized. Testing dates will be emailed to parents closer to the dates.
  - Calendar for 2019/2020 School Year has been released.
  - Iready camp will be before school, from 7:10-7:45 a.m. for extra assistance for students, will begin 3<sup>rd</sup> week of January 2019.
  - Chorus Fundraiser at Fudruckers and their performance at Pembroke Gardens on December 8<sup>th</sup>, 2018.
  - Volunteers that have registered, with the District being behind, we encourage all volunteers to sign-in with a Visitor Pass, to participate in on campus events.
  - LEC Camp for ESOL students, will begin shortly after the New Year.
  - Homework / Make-Up policy, is being addressed.
  - Upper grades are using Canvas to inform students on their teachers' classes and assignments.
  - Safe Haven Grants, is to add Security Cameras/System to add extra security to the campus.
  - The Single Point Buzzer has been installed with a camera, pending a few corrections.
  - The District has a program in place for a Guardian Program, it is pending training and schools that do not currently have an SRO on campus, would get a Guardian.
  - Our campus has a Campus Monitor that is funded by the Aftercare Program here at SPE.
  - General Information, the Broward County Library offers free tutoring.
  - Stop the Bleed, has been completed.
  - 3 Grants have been given based on MSD Students Stop the Violence.
  - December 1 - February 2019 School Choice is opened.

7. SAC/SAF must hold 4 joint meetings a year, for Public Input. 3 More must be completed for the 2018/19 school year. The chairperson to take minutes/agenda of the meeting.

8. Annual Harvest Drive was completed with very much success. 10 bags per family, serving 2300 Families in need. Elementary schools get more participation, than Middle and High Schools.

9. Public Input

Mrs. Fabricio; The Homework Policy, who decides that? Spoken at SAC, taken to the meeting for full cycle DAC every district decides on the policy.

Mrs. Diaz; Integrated Literacy Night, the Safety Segment should have been its own Parent Night presentation. It was a great presentation.
